ROADS.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, having deemed it expedient to open and make the following parish roads through Henry Dendy's Special Survey as hereunder described, viz.—

(1.) *Arthur's Seat Road.*

Commencing at a point bearing south 20 degrees east 1 chain 6 links from the south-east corner of portion No. 30, east of the village of Elsternwick, in the parish of Prahran, and entering Henry Dendy's special survey of 5120 acres, in the parish of Moorabbin, by a line bearing south 20 degrees east 36 chains (at this point a road one chain wide bears south 127 chains), the said Arthur Seat Road then bears south 45 degrees east 179 chains to the southern boundary line of the said special survey.

The bearings are magnetic, and taken from the west side of the road, which is one chain wide throughout.

(2.) *The New Road.*

Commencing at a point 1 chain south from the south-east corner of the Police Reserve in section No. 3 in the village of Elsternwick, parish of Prahran, and being a continuation of Wilmot-street, and running through Henry Dendy's special survey of 5120 acres by lines bearing south 83 chains, south 20 degrees, east 66 chains 90 links, and south 17 chains to the southern boundary line of the said special survey.

The bearings are magnetic, and taken from the west side of the road, which is one chain wide throughout.

(3.) *St. Kilda Road.*

Commencing at a point 1 chain south from the south-east corner of portion No. 1 at South Elwood, in the parish of Prahran, and passing through Henry Dendy's special survey of 5120 acres by lines bearing south 58 chains, south 41

degrees, west 5 chains 25 links, south 5 degrees, west 12 chains 6 links, south 8 chains, thence by a curved line following the natural formation of the terrace 37 chains 50 links to a cross road, thence south 14 degrees east 8 chains 26 links, south 31 chains 50 links, south 48 degrees 30 minutes east 8 chains 30 links to the southern boundary line of the said special survey.

The bearings are magnetic, and taken from the west side of the road, which is one chain wide throughout.

Notice is hereby given, that in conformity with the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council 4 Will. IV. No. 11, intituled "An Act for the making, altering, and improving the Roads throughout the colony of New South Wales, and for opening and improving the Streets in the Towns thereof," a survey or tracing shewing the intended lines of the said roads is now deposited in the office of the Surveyor General, in Melbourne, and all persons interested therein are requested to transmit in writing to the Clerk of the Executive Council, within one month from this date, any well grounded objection which may exist to the formation of the said roads.
