NOTICE TO MARINERS.

LIGHTHOUSE ON ROTTNEST ISLAND.

A Revolving Catoptric Light will be exhibited from the Lighthouse near the centre of Rottnest Island on after the night of 1st June, 1851, during the period between sunset and sunrise.

The Lighthouse is a white stone tower, 53 feet in height, erected on the summit of the island, and is surmounted by a lantern 11 feet

high.
The light will consist of two groups of three powerful lamps cach; the whole revolving once in two minutes, and shewing a flash of light of five seconds' duration every minute, with intervals of 55 seconds of darkness. The centre of the light is 197 feet above high water level, and at the height of 18 feet may be seen in clear weather at a distance of 7 leagues.

Rottnest Lighthouse is in latitude 32 degrees 0 minutes 19 seconds South, longitude 115 degrees 31 minutes 18 seconds East from Greenwich, and stands 3 miles North 75 degrees East by compass from the West extremity of the Island, and $2\frac{3}{4}$ miles West by compass from its East extremity.

LIGHTHOUSE AT ENTRANCE TO SWAN RIVER.

On and after the 1st of June, 1851, a plain continuous light will be exhibited on summit of Arthur's Head, the South point of entrance to Swan River, between sunset and sunrise, for the convenience of shipping making for the ancho-

The light will be 92 feet above high water level, supported by a white stone tower erected on summit of a cliff, and will be visible 5 leagues at sea in clear weather from a height of 18 feet.

1t is in latitude 32 degrees 3 minutes 13 seconds South, longitude 115 degrees 45 minutes 11 seconds East from Greenwich, and bears South 71 degrees East 12 miles from the revolving light on Rottnest Island.

CITY COUNCIL OF MELBOURNE.

HEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, 14th Victoria, No. 20, intituled "An Act for regulating the formation, drainage, and repair of Streets, "Courts, and Alleys, on private property, within the City of Melbourne," it is amongst other things enacted that where any Street, Court, or Alley, on private property, in the City of Melbourne, shall not be, or shall not have been sufficiently paved, flagged, Macadamized, levelled, drained, and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired to the satisfaction of the Council of the said City, it shall be lawful for the said Council at any time and from time to time, by any Order under the hand of the Mayor or Town Clerk of the said City, for the time being respectively, to order that any such Street, Court, or Alley, or any part thereof, shall be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, Macadamized, levelled, drained and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired, in such manner, and within such time as to the said Council may appear expedient; and thereupon the owners of the tenements adjoining or abutting upon such Street, Court or Alley, on each side thereof, shall in such manner and within such time as shall be expressed in such Order, at their respective costs, charges and expenses, remove all obstructions, and well and sufficiently pave, flag, Mucadamize, level, drain and sewer, or otherwise complete or repair, so much of the said Street, Court or Alley, to the centre thereof, as may be opposite to, and co-extensive with, their respective tenements adjoining or abutting on such Streets, Courts, or Alleys respectively; And whereas the Streets, Courts and Alleys enumerated in the Schedule to this Order annexed marked "A," have not been sufficiently paved, flagged, Macadamized, levelled, drained and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired to the satisfaction of the Council of the Cityof Melbourne. Be it now ordered to the satisfaction of the Council of the Cityof Melbourne. by the Council of the said City, that the Streets, Courts, and Alleys enumerated in the Schedule to this by the Council of the said City, that the Streets, Courts, and Alleys enumerated in the Schedule to this Order annexed marked "A" shall, within ten days from the date of this Order coming into operation, be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, Macadamized, levelled, drained and sewered, in such manner as is expressed in the Schedule to this Order annexed marked "B;" and it is hereby notified to the owners respectively of the tenements adjoining or abutting upon the Streets, Courts and Alleys enumerated in the Schedule to this Order annexed marked "A," that if they or any of them shall neglect or omit to remove the obstructions, and pave, flag, Macadamize, level, drain, and sewer, or otherwise complete or repair the Street, Court, or Alley on which their tenements respectively adjoin or abut, in the manner and within the time expressed in this Order, then the Council of the said City will remove all obstructions in the said Streets Courts and Alleys and page flag. Macadamize, level, drain, sewer, and obstructions in the said Streets, Courts and Alleys, and pave, flag, Macadamize, level, drain, sewer, and otherwise complete or repair the same, or such parts thereof as shall not have been so done pursuant to this Order, and will thereupon ascertain, determine, and charge such respective owners with their several proportionate parts of the costs, charges and expenses thereof, according to and co-extensive with their respective tenements adjoining or abutting on such Street, Court or Alley, having regard in such apportionment to the state and condition of the pavement, flagging, Macadamizing, levelling, drainage and sewerage, in which such Streets, Courts or Alleys respectively, or any part thereof shall or may be at the time of making this Order.

SCHEDULE B. REFERRED TO IN THIS ORDER.

Manner in which the Streets, Courts and Alleys, enumerated in Schedule "A," referred to in this Order, are ordered to be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, Macadamized, levelled, drained and sewered.

The natural soil is to be reduced or made up, as the case may require, so that the longitudinal section of the whole right of way shall in no part have an inclination of less than 1 in 120; and wherever practicable, the entire length is to form one incline. In laying on any stuff it is to be spread in layers of not more than one foot thick. The transverse section of the right of way is to show a roadway, whose crown shall be one inch above the kerbs of the footways, and the fall from the crown of the water channels is to be at the rate of 1 in 25.

On either side of the roadway there is to be a water channel eighteen inches wide, consisting of two rows of bluestone pitchers, nine inches deep, and not less than nine inches by fourteen inches on the surface, with upright sides, set in loam, and rammed with a rammer weighing forty pounds so as to subside four inches.

The bottom of the channel is to be seven inches below the top of the kerbs.

On either side of the roadway there is also to be a footway not more than three feet wide; and these are to be separated from the roadway by a red gum plank or kerb ten inches by three, set on edge, and fastened with five inch spikes to piles four inches by four of red gum, three feet long, driven into the

The footways are to be covered with a coat of gravel, three inches thick, and the surface is to fail towards the channel at the rate of 1 in 10. The roadway is to be covered with a coat of broken metal, broken to a two and a-half inch guage, and laid on seven inches thick at the channels, and eight inches at the crown; and this, when necessary, is to be covered with a coat of loam one and a-half inches thick. Wherever private entrances lead from the rights of way they are to be paved to the full width, with bluestone pitchers in the same manner as the channels; the paving is to extend from the channels towards the line of houses or fences, so as to cross the entire footway.

The whole of the work must be done under the inspection and subject to the approval of the City

The whole of the work must be done under the inspection and subject to the approval of the City Surveyor, who is authorised to order any deviation from these general principles, which the particularities of any case may require.

OFFICIAL CORRESPONDENCE.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor direets that until further notice the following Rules are to be invariably observed in conducting official correspondence in this Colony.

1. Letters having reference to patronage, or applications for employment in the Colonial service, are to be addressed to His Excellency's private Secretary.

2. All other correspondence of a public nature is to be carried on through the Colonial Secre-

3. Subordinate Officers and others of a department are not to address themselves directly to the Colonial Secretary, but are to make their communications through the head of the Department, who in forwarding them will add any observations he may consider necessary to illucidate the subject.

4, Each Letter must be confined to a single

subject.

- 5. Letters are to be written in a distinct hand. on foolscap paper of a uniform size, and in order to reduce the expense of postage as much as possible, ordinary letters should be written on half sheet of foolseap with a quarter margin and in as compact a form as to closeness of lines as distinctness will allow; where the subject is of more than ordinary importance, requiring perhaps reference to other correspondence, or Departments, the inner margin must be half the width of the page, but still written in a compact form.
- 6. Each Department is to number its letters in succession commencing annually with a fresh series, and if any Department has much correspondence with two or more others, it should have a separate series of numbering for each of them.

7. Letters are to be divided into distinct paragraphs according to the several points, or heads of the subject, and each paragraph is to be numbered for the greater facility of reference.

8. If a letter consists of two or more sheets, the pages should be numbered.

9. In replying to a letter, the date and number of the letter replied to should be given.

10. Where enclosures are necessary, they must be written on paper of a uniform size with the letter, and in as compact a form as possible.

11. The paragraphs of enclosures must also be numbered, and if consisting of more than two sheets, should be likewise paged.

12. Whenever a minute can be made upon a

letter referred for further information, this course is to be adopted instead of adding another letter to it.

13. Whenever large packages of returns, &c, exceeding the weight of sixteen ounces, can be safely sent by any public conveyance, as by a steam boat or mail cart, at a less cost than if sent by the post, such mode of transit must be adopted: [this rule, however, will principally relate to Departments in Melbourne.]

14. All letters previously to being posted are to have the proper number of postage stamps attached to them, and when stamps cannot be procured the postage must be prepaid; the amount of postage will be generally ascertained by weighing the letter, but it may be stated as a guide, that half a sheet of foolscap with an ordinary envelope weighs under half an ounce, and the postage is consequently two pence; the postage for three half sheets and envelope four pence; for seven

half sheets and envelope eight pence.

15. Postage stamps are to be invariably used whenever it is possible to procure them, in pre-


obtain their stamps from the Postmaster General, and in the country districts, from the several country Postmasters, who will be instructed to

keep a supply, requisitions being made for the number required upon such form as the Postmaster General may point out.

The Heads of the respective Departments are held severally responsible for the economical, and proper issue and employment of the stamps they proper issue and employment of the samp stay receive, and a book or form appended will be kept, in which will be entered on one side the number precured, with the date of receipt, and on the other a daily entry of all letters dispatched, with the number of each class of stamps attached with the number of cach class of stamps attached to them. At the end of the month this return will be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary, signed by the Head of the Department, and the clerk who keeps the book.
