PROCLAMATION,

By HIS EXCELLENCY CHARLES JOSEPH LA TROBE, ESQUIRE, Lieutenant
Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Law, all Mines of Gold and all Gold in its natural place of deposit, within the Colony of Victoria whether on the Lands of the Queen or of any of Her Majesty's subjects, belong to the Crown: And whereas information has been received by the Government that Gold exists upon and in the soil of the Colony, and that certain persons have commenced, or are about to commence, searching and digging for the same, for their own use, without leave or other authority from Her Majesty: Now, I, CHARLES JOSEPH LA TROBE, ESQUIRE, the Lieutenant Governor aforesaid, on behalf of Her Majesty, do hereby publicly notify and declare, that all persons who shall take from any Lands within the said Colony, any Gold Metal, or Ore containing Gold, or who within any of the Waste Lands which have not yet been alienated by the Crown, shall dig for and disturb the soil in search of such Gold Metal or Ore without having been duly authorised in that behalf, by Her Majesty's Colonial Government, will be prosecuted, both Criminally and Civilly, as the Law allows: And I further notify and declare, that such Regulations as, upon further information, may be found expedient, will be speedily prepared and published setting forth the terms on which Licenses will be issued for this purpose, on the payment of a reasonable fee.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at the Government Office, Melbourne, this fifteenth day of August, in the Year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, and in the fifteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Charles Joseph La Trobe, Esquire, Lieutenant-Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Lands belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies;" I do hereby notify and proclaim, that at eleven o'clock of Tuesday, the sixteenth day of September next, the following Town Allotments will be offered for sale by public auction, at the auction room of Messrs Tennent and Cropper, Elizabeth-street, Melbourne, at the upset price affixed to each lot respectively, on the terms and conditions, and under the provisions of the above recited Act. (Deposit 10 per cent.)
