PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the fifth and sixth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the Sale of Waste Lands belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim, that at Eleven o'clock of Wednesday, the Nineteenth day of May next, the following Suburban and Country Lands will be offered for Sale by Public Auction, at the Police Office, Portland, at the upset price affixed to each lot respectively, on the terms and conditions, and under the provisions of the above recited Act. (Deposit 10 per cent.)

By His Excellency Charles Joseph La Trobe, Esquire, Lieutenant-Governor in and over the Colony of Victoria, and its dependencies.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant-Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, made and passed in the fifteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better administration of justice in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant-Governor of the said Colony by any orders to be by him, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, from time to time made and proclaimed, to define the limits of Districts within, and the times at which Circuit Courts shall be holden in the said Colony, and the said limits and times, to alter and vary as he shall, with the advice aforesaid, deem necessary; and to direct that Circuit Courts shall be holden at such Towns or places within those limits as he shall, with the advice aforesaid, think fit to appoint. And whereas it is advisable that Circuit Courts should be holden at the respective Towns of Geelong and Portland, in the said Colony, and it is expedient to define the boundaries and limits of the respective Districts within which such Circuit Courts shall be holden within the said Colony, and to fix the respective times at which such Courts shall be holden within those limits

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant Governor

aforsaid, with the advice of the said Executive Council, do hereby order and direct that Circuit Courts, for the trial of Civil as well as Criminal issues, and for the purpose of inquiring into and assessing damages in Actions at Law, shall be holden within the following Districts in the said Colony, to be called respectively the Geelong and Portland Circuit Districts

And I do, with the advice aforesaid, order and direct that the aforesaid Geelong Circuit District shall consist of all parts of the Colony of Victoria comprehended within the County, or reputed County of Grant, and also within the Counties of Polwarth, Heytesbury, Villiers, Grenville, Hampden, and Ripon, according to the boundaries thereof respectively set forth in a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of New South Wales, bearing date the 29th day of December, 1848, and published in the New South Wales *Government Gazette* of the 30th day of December, 1848; and also all parts of the said Colony of Victoria comprehended within the following boundary lines, that is to say, commencing at the source of the River Avoca, near Mount Cole, to Lake Bael Bael; thence by a line north to the River Murray; thence along the said River Murray to its junction with the River Darling; thence by a line to Lake Hindmarsh; and thence in a southerly direction to and along the River Wimmera, to a point on that river from which a line south-east will strike Mount Zero; thence by that line to Mount Zero; thence along the Grampian Range and the northern boundary line of the said County of Ripon to the source of the River Avoca aforesaid

And I do with the advice aforesaid, further order and direct that the aforesaid Portland Circuit District, shall consist of all parts of the Colony of Victoria, comprehended within the County or reputed County of Normanby, and within the Counties of Follet and Dundas, according to the boundaries thereof set forth in a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales, bearing date the 29th day of December, 1848, published in the New South Wales *Government Gazette* of the 30th day of December, 1848, and also all parts of the said Colony of Victoria, comprehended within the following boundary lines, that is to say, commencing at the point of intersection of the Grampian Range with the Northern Boundary line of the County of Ripon, thence by that Range to Mount Zero, thence by a line North West to the River Wimmera, and along the said River Wimmera to Lake Hindmarsh, thence by a line to the River Murray at its junction with the River Darling, thence by the said River Murray to the boundary line dividing the said Colony of Victoria from the Colony of South Australia, and thence by the said boundary line to the Mosquito Creek, thence by the Northern Boundary of the Counties of Follett and Dundas, and part of Ripon aforesaid, to the said point of intersection

And I do with the advice aforesaid, further order, direct, and appoint that the aforesaid Circuit Court within the said Geelong Circuit District hereinbefore described, shall be holden at the Town of Geelong in the said Circuit District, on the 20th day of April, the 25th day of June, and the 20th day of October, in the year of our Lord 1852, and on the 1st day of February, the 20th day of April, the 25th day of June, and the

20th day of October, in every following year, until otherwise ordered; And that the aforesaid Circuit Court within the said Portland Circuit District hereinbefore described, shall be holden at the Town of Portland in the said Circuit District, on the 15th day of June, and the 15th day of December, in the year of our Lord 1852; and on the 10th day of February, and the 15th day of June, during every following year until otherwise ordered.

And I do with the advice aforesaid order and direct, that if any of the days aforesaid shall happen to fall on a Sunday, the said Court shall commence on the Monday next following.
