NATIONAL SCHOOLS.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant Governor directs the publication of the following Notice for General Information.

By His Excellency's Command,
W. LONSDALE.

THE following will be the Scale of Salaries to be paid to Teachers of National Schools from the 1st April last, viz. :—

Male Teachers, where there are less than 30 Children under Tuition—£70 per Annum.

Ditto, where there are at least 30 Children under Tuition—£80 per Annum.

Female Teachers, where there are at least 20 Children under Tuition—£20 per Annum.

Ditto, where there are at least 30 Children under Tuition—£30 per Annum.

Where the number of Scholars considerably exceeds 30, or, where the Teachers are shewn to have evinced peculiar ability, the same will be taken into special consideration.

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.
