GOLD DEPOSITED AT THE COLONIAL TREASURY.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant Governor deems it advisable to point out to those Persons who forward their Gold by Escort, that it is desirable it should in all possible instances be consigned to Agents in Town, in order to its being removed at as early a date as possible from the Colonial Treasury; it being found that the existing practice of leaving it for a considerable length of time unclaimed is extremely inconvenient, and attended with expense. His Excellency is therefore pleased to direct that all Persons who do not claim and take away their Gold at present deposited at the Treasury within Thirty Days after the 1st of next Month, or who do not take away the Gold which may hereafter be sent to the Treasury within Thirty Days of the date of deposit, will be required to pay One Penny an Ounce for each Week that the Gold is left at the Treasury beyond the stated period of Thirty Days.
