PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency CHARLES JOSEPH LA TROBE,
Esquire, Lieutenant Governor of the Colony
of Victoria and its Dependence, &c., &c.,
&c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under my hand and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date at Melbourne, the third day of January, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, I did, amongst other things, direct and appoint that the Court of General Sessions for Grant should be holden at the Town of Geelong, upon the fifteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three: And whereas it is expedient to alter the day so appointed as aforesaid, now therefore I, Charles Joseph La Trobe, Esquire, as such Lieutenant Governor as aforesaid, do hereby direct and appoint that the Court of General Sessions for Grant shall be holden at the Town of Geelong, upon the eighth day of April, 1853.

DESCRIPTION OF THE MEN.

The ringleader was a short sized man, dark coloured, black whiskers, clean shaved, had on a dark coloured top coat, an oil-skin wide-awake hat, a muffling handkerchief, of a light colour, about 5 feet 8 inches in height, his appearance was above the common order, very clean and fresh, not like a man off a journey, wore a black silk neckerchief, and a white shirt.

Another of them, lower in height, a thin man, pale faced, rather pitted with the small pox, wore a black oil-skin coat, buttoned at the neck, a black sou'-wester hat; no beard or whiskers, thin long nose, had on dark trousers, belt round his waist, and a revolver stuck in the right side of it, had besides a long horse pistol.

The other had on a blue shirt, a yellow leather belt and spurs, light haired, whiskers all under his chin, with moustachios, height about 5 feet 6 inches. The Robbers and the murdered man appeared to have some knowledge of each other.
