HEREAS it has been represented to the Government that about two o'clock in the afternoon of the 8th instant, Mr. Francis Hinsby and Mr. Buckhurst were attacked and robbed near Mr. Orr's Station, on the Coliban, by a party of armed Bushrangers, by one of whom Mr. Hinsby was shot in the face: Notice is hereby given that a Reward of Two Hundred Pounds will be paid to any person or persons who shall give such information as may lead to the apprehension and conviction of any of the said Bushrangers.

DESCRIPTION OF THE MEN.

- 1. (The Man who shot Mr. Hinsby.)—Full face, light whiskers, fair complexion, had on long boots, and rode a chesnut horse.
- 2. (The Man who robbed Mr. Hinsby after he was shot.)—Middle height, 22 or 23 years of age, fair complexion, little whiskers, rode a chesnut horse, had blankets on the saddle.
- 3. Had on a light great coat; he rode away with the other two.
