WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "*An Act to make Provision for the better Administration of Justice in County Courts in the Colony of Victoria*," it was amongst other things enacted, that Local Courts, to be called County Courts, should be established and holden in and for such Cities, Towns, Counties, and other portions of the said Colony of Victoria as the Lieutenant Governor should appoint; and that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony from time to time to define by Proclamation the limits and boundaries of such Cities, Towns, Counties, and portions of the said Colony, and the times at which such Courts should be holden, and any such limits, boundaries, places, and times to vary, alter, and repeal as the said Lieutenant Governor should think fit: And whereas by a Proclamation under my hand and the seal of the said Colony, bearing date at Melbourne, in the said Colony, the third day of January, 1853, I did amongst other things declare and appoint the times at which the County Court of Grant should be holden; and whereas it is expedient that the time for holding the said County Court of Grant should be altered and varied: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant Governor aforesaid, by virtue of the power and authority in that behalf in me vested, do hereby direct and appoint that the County Court of Grant shall be holden at the Town of Geelong, on the sixteenth day of August, the fourteenth day of September, the sixteenth day of November, and the twenty-seventh day of December, 1853: And I do further declare and appoint, that if the Judge of the said Court should not arrive in the said town of Geelong in time to open the said Court on the days hereinbefore appointed, the same may be opened and held on any day or days following such days so appointed.

ships and vessels, and all persons, goods, wares, merchandise, and other articles and things whatsoever, coming, or brought in, or being on board such ships, vessels and boats, shall in every case perform Quarantine for a period of not less than two days, such period to be extended as may be found necessary in any particular case, by any order to be made by the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

CONDITIONS, ETC.

1. It must be understood that, in all instances, the usual Mail road between the points above mentioned is understood to be signified; and, where no Mail has been previously run, that course is to be adopted which the Chief Postmaster may direct, or which the Contractor may specify in his tender.

2. Intending Contractors must give due consideration to the winter difficulties of the roads, including the necessity for provision for the crossing of rivers and creeks by boat or otherwise; and they must bear in mind that no excuse for delay will be even entertained, unless supported by the certificates of persons of known position and respectability, as to the cause of delay, and that it is attributable to no want of liberal provision both for ordinary duties, and to overcome difficulties arising from stress of weather, or the various accidents to which the men, horses, vehicles, and other means employed may be liable.

3. It is to be understood that the Mails are to be despatched and conveyed on the days and hours to

be fixed by the Chief Postmaster, either according to the present arrangement, or as he may afterwards determine for the public convenience.

4. On all roads where wheel vehicles can travel, a preference will be given to carriage conveyance; but Contractors may propose any method, bearing in mind that they will be held strictly bound to use the conveyance they propose. The rate of travelling is not to be less than six miles an hour, including all stoppages.

5. The Contractors are to carry all bags, letters, packets, and newspapers, which may be delivered to them under the authority of the Chief Postmaster or any of the Postmasters, and to provide secure and waterproof lockers for the Mails in carriages, and covering for the bags on horseback.

6. In the event of the Contractor neglecting to perform the duty of conveying the Mails, at such times as the Chief Postmaster may choose to appoint, all necessary conveyance will be engaged at the expense of the Contractor, and the cost deducted from any payment becoming due to him.

7. Contractors will be liable to a fine of five shillings for every five minutes delay after specified time of starting; and to a like penalty for every ten minutes delay after the specified time of arrival, except for the first five or ten minutes respectively.

8. Contractors are particularly to remember that both on the main and branch lines they will be fined for the full delay that may, in consequence of their late arrival at any point on their line, ensue, in the further transmission of the Mail entrusted to them, and not merely for the amount of late arrival at such point. In such cases, unless strong disproof of blame can, as prescribed in Clause No. 2, be produced, the delaying Contractor can only avert or lighten the penalty by forwarding the Mail by express to its final destination, or until it overtakes the proper conveyance at a Post Office, and is there consigned to the charge of the Postmaster in time for due transmission.

9. Contractors will be bound to prevent the conveyance of any letter or packet by any of their servants or passengers, or otherwise, to the prejudice of the Post Office revenue; but they will be bound to collect loose letters and private bags on the road, which must be delivered up to the Postmaster at the first Post Office arrived at, under the penalty of £5 for each and every offence in either respect.

10. A mail cart or carriage drawn by one horse must not carry more than one passenger; by two horses, not more than three passengers; and by three or more horses, not more than six passengers, exclusive of the driver, under the penalty of £3 for each passenger in excess. The Chief Postmaster will have the power, when it appears that delays have ensued, or are likely to ensue, from the carrying of passengers, to limit the number further, or forbid the conveyance of any under the same penalty. A preference will be given to Contractors who will dispense with passenger traffic.

11. The drivers and postmen to be free, and of certified good character, and, together with the horses and vehicles employed in the conveyance of Mails, to be at all times subject to the inspection and approval or rejection of the Chief Postmaster.

12. Contractors are requested to state the rate at which they will provide, on the requisition of the Chief Postmaster, a seat in their conveyance for officers of the department travelling on the public service. The Contractors for Nos. 29 and 30 will be bound to provide such conveyance free whenever required.

13. The Chief Postmaster can appoint deputies to exercise all or any of the powers reposed in him by the Contracts.

14. All fines and penalties incurred under the agreement are to be deducted by the Chief Postmaster from the next instalment falling due to the contractors, and are to be considered as over and above any penalties established by any Act of Council.

15. Each party tendering, or agent for him, must attend at the Audit Office, on the day appointed for opening the Tenders, and each Tender must bear
