By His Excellency CHARLES JOSEPH LA TROBE,
Esquire, Lieutenant Governor in and for
the Colony of Victoria and its Depen-
dencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the provi-
sions of an Act of the Imperial Par-
liament of Great Britain and Ireland, made
and passed in the fifth and sixth years of the
Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, inti-
tuled, "*An Act for the Government of New
South Wales, and Van Diemen's Land;*"
and of a certain other Act of the said Parlia-
ment, made and passed in the thirteenth and
fourteenth years of the said Reign, intituled,
"*An Act for the better Government of Her
Majesty's Australian Colonies;*" and also
of an Act of the Governor and Legislative
Council of New South Wales, made and
passed in the fourteenth year of the said

reign, known as "*The Victoria Electoral Act
of 1851;*" and furthermore of an Act of the
Governor and Legislative Council of the Co-
lony of Victoria, made and passed in the six-
teenth year of the said Reign, intituled, "*An

of the Legislative Council of the Colony of
Victoria;*" And in pursuance of the power
delegated by Her Majesty in that behalf, I
did by Letters Patent under the Public Seal
of the Colony, appoint certain persons to be

now I, CHARLES JOSEPH LA TROBE, as such
Lieutenant Governor aforesaid, do hereby pro-
claim that in pursuance of the authority
in me vested, I have by Letters Patent,
bearing even date herewith, appointed—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency CHARLES JOSEPH LA TROBE, Esquire, Lieutenant Governor in and for the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the provisions of an Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, made and passed in the fifth and sixth years of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "*An Act for the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land;*" and of a certain other Act of the said Parliament, made and passed in the thirteenth and fourteenth years of the said Reign, intituled, "*An Act for the better Government of Her Majesty's Australian Colonies;*" and also of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, made and passed in the fourteenth year of the said Reign, known as "*The Victoria Electoral Act of 1851;*" and furthermore of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria,

made and passed in the sixteenth year of the said Reign, intituled, "*An Act to alter 'The Victoria Electoral Act of 1851,' and to increase the number of Members of the Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria;*" And, in pursuance of the Power delegated by Her Majesty in that behalf, I did, by Letters Patent under the Public Seal of the Colony, appoint certain persons to be Non-Elective Members of the Legislative Council by the said Acts established; And whereas ARCHIBALD MICHIE, Esquire, one of the persons named in such Letters Patent, hath, by a writing under his hand addressed to me, resigned his seat in the said Legislative Council: Now I, Charles Joseph La Trobe, as such Lieutenant Governor aforesaid, do hereby proclaim that in pursuance of the authority in me vested, I have by Letters Patent, bearing even date herewith, appointed

ANDREW ALDCORN, Esquire, M.D.,

to be a Member of the said Legislative Council, in lieu of the said Archibald Michie, Esquire, and until Her Majesty's pleasure shall be known.
