By His Excellency CHARLES JOSEPH LA TROBE, Esquire, Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by an Act of the Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, made and passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "*An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*," it is amongst other things enacted, "That it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to declare that Tolls shall be payable and collected at any Punt or Ferry which shall be constructed, repaired, or supported at the public expense, and to cause such Toll-houses and Ferry-houses, Gates, Bars, Chains, Rails and Fences to be built and set up as shall be deemed necessary to prevent any person, beast, or carriage from passing by or over such Ferry or Punt, unless there shall be paid the Tolls lawfully payable thereat under the authority of this Act;" And whereas it is expedient that Tolls shall be payable and collected at the Punt or Ferry known as "Maiden's Punt," situate on the Murray River, about two miles in a direct line above its junction with the Campaspe, in the Colony of Victoria: Now therefore I, Charles Joseph La Trobe, Esquire, as such Lieutenant Governor as aforesaid, by virtue of the said Act, and in furtherance of the power and authority thereby in me vested, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that Tolls shall be payable and collected at the Punt or Ferry situate on the Murray River, in the said Colony of Victoria.
