During the first Quarter of the new system of Registration, there has been registered in Melbourne and Suburbs 695 Deaths.—Of these 393 were Males and 302 Females. The next in order of fatality was Convulsions being 155 per cent; the next Pneumonia or Inflammation of the Lungs being 140 per cent; and then followed Dysentery 86 per cent; Hooping Cough and Croup 69 per cent; Brain Disease 60 per cent; Bronchitis, &c., 6 per cent; Typhus Fever, &c., 5 per cent; Scariatica 43 per cent; and Gastritis and Enteritis 17 per cent. Of the 592 Male Deaths registered above 5 years of age, 20.53 per cent have resulted from Zymotic or Epidemic Diseases, (Class 1.); 25.39 per cent from affections of the Respiratory Organs, (Class 4.); 10.00 per cent from Injuries, Intemperance, &c., (Class 12.); 14.06 per cent from Diseases of Nervous System including Delirium Tremens, (Class 3.); 3.97 per cent of Heart Disease, (Class 5.); and 8.97 per cent from diseases of the Digestive Organs, (Class 6).

Of the 257 registered Female Deaths, 117, or 45·5 per cent were Children under five years of age. It will be seen above, that the Male Deaths among Children at that age amounted to 110, an approximation of numbers remarkably close. The following per centages of Female Children under five years of age died of the different diseases that affect Male Children in the same age, will show the different degrees of death force in the diseases that affect Infants of both sexes respectively. The list is as follows, &c., being 10·25 per cent. The next chief agent of destruction in Scantlandia, being 14·5 per cent. Among Males it was 4·3 per cent only. The third on the list is Typhenteric, &c., being 10·25 per cent. The fourth is Convulsions, &c., being 9·89 per cent; Convulsions 9·89 per cent; and Disease of Brain &c., the same. Tenthling and Tabes 5·68 per cent; Of the 140 Female Deaths, 83 per cent have resulted from Respiratory Affections (Class 4); 40 per cent from Zymotic or Endemic Diseases (Class 1); 10 per cent from Affections of the Nervous System, without any instance of Delirium Tremens (Class 8); 5 per cent from Affections of the Digestive Organs (Class 6); 4·25 per cent from Injuries, Intemperance, &c., (Class 12), and but two cases of Heart Disease (Class 6).

## PROCLAMATION

BY THE QUEEN.

**W**HEREAS it has been represented to Us that in Our Colonies in Australia, New Zealand, Ceylon, Mauritius, and Hong Kong, the silver coins of Our United Kingdom pass current as an unlimited tender for payments, and it is expedient that the regulations which govern the circulation of the coins of Our United Kingdom as by law established, should be enforced in Our said Colonies: Now therefore We, by the advice of Our Privy Council, have thought fit to declare and ordain, and by the advice aforesaid We do hereby declare and ordain that within and throughout our Colonies in Australia, New Zealand, Ceylon, Mauritius, and Hong Kong, the coins of our United Kingdom shall pass current in the manner directed in the several Acts of Parliament which regulate the currency of the same, and that the silver coins of Our United Kingdom shall not be a legal tender in payment of sums exceeding forty shillings.

By His Excellency CHARLES JOSEPH LA TROBE, Esquire, Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS in pursuance of the powers vested in me, I did by my Proclamation under my hand and seal, bearing date the seventeenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, order and direct that the provisions of a certain Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the second year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "*An Act for regulating the Police in the Towns of Paramatta, Windsor, Maitland, Bathurst, and other Towns respectively, and for removing and preventing Nuisances and Obstructions, and for the better alignment of Streets therein,*" be extended to Williamstown, in the County of Bourke, in the Colony of Victoria; And whereas it is expedient to enlarge and define the limits of the said town of Williamstown, and to extend thereto the provisions of the aforesaid Act, as amended by a certain other Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the eleventh year of Her said Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act to amend 'An Act for regulating the Police in the Towns of Paramatta, Windsor, Maitland, Bathurst, and other Towns respectively, and for removing and preventing Nuisances and Obstructions, and for the better alignment of Streets therein,'*" And whereas it is also expedient that a certain Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her said Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act to amend an Act intituled 'An Act for regulating the Police in the Towns of Paramatta, Windsor, Maitland, Bathurst, and*

*other Towns respectively, and for removing and preventing Nuisances and Obstructions, and for the better alignment of Streets therein,'*" should also be extended to Williamstown, as hereinafter defined: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the power and authority vested in me by the said recited Acts, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do by this my Proclamation hereby direct and declare that the provisions of the aforesaid recited Acts shall extend to and be in force in the Town of Williamstown, in the County of Bourke, in the Colony of Victoria; and that the following shall be deemed to be the boundaries of the said Town for the purposes of the said recited Acts, that is to say: Commencing at the south east corner of portion eight of section one, parish of Cut-paw-paw, purchased by John and Michael Harman, and bounded by lines bearing north fifty-six chains, north thirty-six degrees, west forty-nine chains seventy links, east fifty-eight chains twenty-nine links to Hobson's Bay, and by that Bay and Port Phillip Bay to the point of commencement.

that Tolls shall be payable and collected at the Punt or Ferry situate on the Murray River, in the said Colony of Victoria.
