## APPEALS TO THE QUEEN IN COUNCIL.

**H**IS Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has been pleased to direct the publication, for general information, of the following Order, made by Her Majesty in Council, on the 13th June last, establishing certain Rules and Regulations in Appeals to the Queen in Council from the Colonies, and from the territories of the East India Company, with a view to greater economy, despatch, and efficiency in the appellate jurisdiction of Her Majesty.

Whereas there was this day read at the Board a report from the Right Honorable the Lords of the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council, dated the 30th May last past, humbly setting forth that the Lords of the Judicial Committee have taken into consideration the practice of the Committee with a view to greater economy, despatch, and efficiency in the appellate jurisdiction of Her Majesty in Council, and that their Lordships have agreed humbly to report to Her Majesty that it is expedient that certain changes should be made in the existing practice in Appeals, and recommending that certain Rules and Regu-

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lations therein set forth should henceforth be observed, obeyed, and carried into execution, provided Her Majesty is pleased to approve the same:

Her Majesty, having taken the said Report into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve thereof, and of the Rules and Regulations set forth therein, in the words following, videlicet:—

*Appellant, when successful, may recover Costs of Appeal.*

I. That, any former usage or practice of Her Majesty's Privy Council notwithstanding, an Appellant who shall succeed in obtaining a reversal or material alteration of any judgment, decree, or order appealed from, shall be entitled to recover the costs of the Appeal from the Respondent, except in cases in which the Lords of the Judicial Committee may think fit otherwise to direct.

*Transcripts to be sent to Registrar of Privy Council.*

II. That the Registrar or other proper officer having the custody of records in any Court or special jurisdiction from which an Appeal is brought to Her Majesty in Council be directed to send by post, with all possible despatch, one certified copy of the transcript record in each cause to the Registrar of Her Majesty's Privy Council, Whitehall; and that all such transcripts be registered in the Privy Council Office, with the date of their arrival, the names of the parties, and the date of the sentence appealed from; and that such transcript be accompanied by a correct and complete index of all the papers, documents, and exhibits in the cause; and that the Registrar of the Court appealed from, or other proper officer of such Court, be directed to omit from such transcript all merely formal documents, provided such omission be stated and certified in the said index of papers; and that especial care be taken

not to allow any document to be set forth more than once in such transcript; and that no other certified copies of the record be transmitted to agents in England by or on behalf of the parties in the suit; and that the fees and expenses incurred and paid for the preparation of such transcript be stated and certified upon it by the Registrar or other officer preparing the same.

*Transcripts may be printed abroad.*

III. That when the record of proceedings or evidence in the cause appealed has been printed or partly printed abroad, the Registrar or other proper officer of the Court from which the Appeal is brought shall be bound to send home the same in a printed form, either wholly or so far as the same may have been printed, and that he do certify the same to be correct, on two copies, by signing his name on every printed sheet, and by affixing the seal, if any, of the Court appealed from to these copies, with the sanction of the Court.

And that in all cases in which the parties in Appeals shall think fit to have the proceedings printed abroad, they shall be at liberty to do so, provided they cause fifty copies of the same to be printed in folio, and transmitted, at their expense, to the Registrar of the Privy Council, two of which printed copies shall be certified as above by the officers of the Court appealed from; and in this case no further expense for copying or printing the record will be incurred or allowed in England.

*Written Transcripts to be printed by Her Majesty's Printer.*

IV. That on the arrival of a written transcript of appeal at the Privy Council Office, Whitehall, the Appellant or the agent of the Appellant prosecuting the same shall be at liberty to call on the Registrar of the Privy Council to cause it, or such part thereof as may be necessary for the hearing of the case, and likewise all such parts thereof as the Respondent or his agent may require, to be printed by Her Majesty's Printer, or by any other printer on the same terms, the Appellant or his agent engaging to pay the cost of preparing a copy for the printer at a rate not exceeding one shilling per brief sheet, and likewise the cost of printing such record or appendix, and that one hundred copies of the same be struck off, whereof thirty copies are to be delivered to the agents on each side, and forty kept for the use of the Judicial Committee; and that no other fees for solicitors' copies of the transcript, or for drawing the joint appendix, be henceforth allowed, the solicitors on both sides being allowed to have access to the original papers at the Council Office, and to extract or cause to be extracted and copied such parts thereof as are necessary for the preparation of the petition of appeal, at the stationer's charge not exceeding one shilling per brief sheet.

*Transcripts to be printed within a certain time.*

V. That a certain time be fixed within which it shall be the duty of the Appellant or his agent to make such application for the printing of the transcript, and that such time be within the space of six calendar months from the arrival of the transcript and the registration thereof in all matters brought by appeal from Her Majesty's colonies and plantations east of the Cape of Good Hope or from the territories of the East India

Company, and within the space of three months in all matters brought by appeal from any other part of Her Majesty's dominions abroad; and that in default of the Appellant or his agent taking effectual steps for the prosecution of the Appeal within such time or times respectively, the Appeal shall stand dismissed without further order, and that a report of the same be made to the Judicial Committee by the Registrar of the Privy Council at their Lordships' next sitting.

*Appeals may be heard in the form of a Special Case.*

VI. That whenever it shall be found that the decision of a matter on appeal is likely to turn exclusively on a question of law, the agents of the parties, with the sanction of the Registrar of the Privy Council, may submit such question of law to the Lords of the Judicial Committee in the form of a special case, and print such parts only of the transcript as may be necessary for the discussion of the same; provided that nothing herein contained shall in any way bar or prevent the Lords of the Judicial Committee from ordering the full discussion of the whole case, if they shall so think fit; and that in order to promote such arrangements and simplification of the matter in dispute, the Registrar of the Privy Council may call the agents of the parties before him, and having heard them, and examined the transcript, may report to the Committee as to the nature of the proceedings.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the foregoing Rules and Regulations be punctually observed, obeyed, and carried into execution in all appeals or petitions and complaints in the nature of Appeals brought to Her Majesty, or to Her heirs and successors, in Council, from Her Majesty's Colonies and plantations abroad, and from the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man, and from the territories of the East India Company, whether the same be from courts of justice or from special jurisdictions, other than Appeals from Her Majesty's Courts of Vice-Admiralty, to which the said rules are not to be applied.

Whereof the Judges and officers of Her Majesty's Courts of Justice abroad, and the Judges and officers of the Superior Courts of the East India Company, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

INFORMATION FOR THE USE OF MILITARY AND NAVAL OFFICERS PROPOSING TO SETTLE IN CERTAIN OF THE BRITISH COLONIES.

1. Privileges in the acquisition of Land are at present allowed to Military and Naval Officers in the Colonies of New South Wales, Victoria, Van Dieman's Land, South Australia, Western Australia, New Zealand, Ceylon, and the Cape of Good Hope. As, however, the control of the Waste Land of the Crown in New Zealand is vested in the Legislature of that Colony, it must be distinctly understood that Her Majesty's Government cannot guarantee the continuance of the following regulations, but that they will be liable to be altered or discontinued

by the local Legislature; and the same caution will be applicable to any other of the Colonies named, in which the same control may hereafter be transferred to the local Legislature.

The same privileges are extended to Officers of the East India Company's Service in Van Diemen's Land.

2. In the abovenamed Colonies, land is disposed of by sale only; but Officers purchasing land, are allowed a remission of the purchase money, according to the undermentioned scale:

Field Officers, of 25 years' service and upwards, in the whole	£600
Field Officers, of 20 years' service and upwards, in the whole	500
Field Officers, of 15 or less years' service, in the whole	400
Captains, of 20 years' service and upwards, in the whole	400
Captains, of 15 years' service or less, in the whole	300
Subalterns, of 20 years' service and upwards, in the whole	300
Subalterns, of 7 years' service and upwards, in the whole	200
Subalterns, under 7 years' standing, are not entitled to any remission in the purchase of land.	

Regimental Staff Officers, and Medical Officers of the Army and Navy, are allowed the benefit of this Rule:—but Military Chaplains, Commissariat Officers, and Officers of any of the Civil Departments of the Army; Pursers, Chaplains, Midshipmen, Warrant Officers of every description, and Officers of any of the Civil Departments of the Navy, are not allowed any privileges in respect of land. Although members of these classes may have been admitted formerly, and under different circumstances, they are now excluded. Mates in the Royal Navy rank with Ensigns in the Army, and Mates of three years' standing, with Lieutenants in the Army, and are entitled respectively to corresponding privileges in the acquisition of lands.

3. In order to take advantage of this privilege, Officers of the Army and Navy on full or half pay, should provide themselves with a Certificate from the Office of the General Commanding-in-Chief, or of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, or of the Master General of the Ordnance, shewing that their settlement in a British Colony has been sanctioned, and stating their rank and length of service. No document from the Office of the Secretary of State is necessary.

4. This certificate will not on any account be issued more than once to the same Officer, or to any Officer on half Pay who shall for two years immediately preceding the date of this Notice have resided in the Colony in which he seeks to make it available.

5. Gentlemen who have ceased to belong to Her Majesty's service will not be allowed advantages in the acquisition of Land. This rule, however, is not to affect Officers who, having obtained permission to settle in a British Colony, have quitted the service for the purpose of doing so. But, in such cases, it will be necessary that their Certificate of service and permission should bear the date of their retirement from the service, and that, within one year from that date, but not otherwise, it should be presented to the Governor of one of the abovenamed Colonies, which will be sufficient warrant for allowing the bearer the advantages to which his rank and length of service may entitle him according to the above scale.

6. The object of the Regulations being to encourage the permanent settlement in the abovenamed Colonies of Military and Naval Officers, and it being necessary to prevent those who have no intention of settling there from taking advantage of the privilege, Officers will not for the space of two years from the making out of their Certificates, receive a Crown Grant for any land purchased by such Certificates, but will, in the meantime, receive a "Location Ticket." At the expiration of two years, the Officer, on shewing to the satisfaction of the Governor that he is *bona fide* a resident Settler in the Colony, and

has so resided continuously since receiving his "Location Ticket," will be entitled to a Crown Grant in exchange for it. If, however, application should not be made for the exchange of the "Location Ticket" within 12 months from the expiration of the two years for which it is granted, it will be considered to have lapsed, and the Land will be open to sale or grant. In case of the Officer's dying while holding a "Location Ticket," the land to which it refers will be transferred to his legal representative.

In case of such death occurring before the "Location Ticket" is obtained, the Governor of the Colony is authorized to make the Certificate available in favour of the Child, or other nearest representative, of the deceased Officer, as he may find advisable.

7. For the convenience of Officers, the following heads are subjoined of the Rules for the sale of Land in the Australian Settlements:—

All lands are disposed of by sale alone, and must have been once at least exposed to public auction.

The lowest upset price is not less than £1 per acre; but the Government has power to raise the same by Proclamation, though not again to reduce it.

The lands are distinguished into three different classes; viz., Town Lots, Suburban Lots, and Country Lots.

Upon Town and Suburban Lots, as well as upon a proportion not exceeding one-tenth of the whole of the Country Lots offered for sale at any auction, the Governor has the power of naming a higher than the general or lowest upset price, these last to be designated "Special Country Lots."

Town and Suburban Lots are in no case disposed of except by public auction; but Country Lots, which have already been put up to public auction, and not sold, may be disposed of afterwards by private contract at the upset price.

No Lands are sold by private contract, except for ready money. When sold by public auction, one-tenth at least of the whole purchase money must be put down, and the remainder within one calendar month, or the deposit is forfeited.

Lands are put up for sale in Lots not exceeding one mile in extent.

8. In Ceylon, land is sold by auction at an upset price, which is to be fixed by the Governor, but which is not to be less than £1 per acre. Before the Lands are exposed for sale, they will be surveyed by the Government, and duly advertised.

9. At the Cape of Good Hope, the upset price is 2s. per acre in the old Colony, and 4s. per acre in the District of Natal.

10. The several prices above mentioned are of course subject to a revision at any time by the proper authorities, and the pecuniary amount of the Remission made to Officers cannot be increased on account of an increased value set upon the Lands.

## REVOLVING LIGHT ON CAPE OTWAY.

Trinity House, London,

20th July, 1853.

The following particulars respecting the Revolving Light at Cape Otway (the first exhibition of which in August, 1848, was notified from this House, on the 11th April, 1849,) having been communicated to this Corporation by direction of Her Majesty's Secretary of State for the Colonies, are hereby made public for the general information of Mariners, viz.:—The Light House on Cape Otway in Bass's Strait is situate in latitude 38d. 51m. south, and in longitude 143d. 29m. east. The Light revolves, shewing a bright flash once in every minute, and burns at the height of 300 feet above the level of high water, and may be seen, by estimation, at the distance of eight leagues.

Mariners are requested to observe that the Reef off Cape Otway lies about one-half or three-quarters of a mile therefrom, in a S.E. to S.S.W. direction, and extends 1½ miles to the westward.

## NOTICE TO MARINERS.

A DANGEROUS Rock, with only eleven (11) feet of water over it at low tide, has recently been discovered nearly three-quarters of a mile west of Point Nepean. It is not laid down in any of the charts of this port. Commanders of vessels navigating between the Heads, are requested to observe the following marks, in order to avoid the said rock (which will hereafter be known as the "CORSAIR ROCK"), and are recommended to lay down its position on their charts, as given underneath.

*Magnetic position of the centre of the "Corsair Rock."*

Upper lighthouse on Shortland's Bluff...	... ..	N. 21 E.
Middle of the Recky Islet off Point Nepean	... ..	N. 87 E.

Tidal flagstaff on Point Lonsdale S. 76 E.

The above rock is about twenty (20) feet in diameter; the least water found over it at low tide is eleven (11) feet, with three (3), four (4), and five (5) fathoms water all round.

There is a clear passage between the "Corsair Rock" and the extreme end of Nepean Reef, of about a cable's length, with three (3), four (4), and five (5) fathoms of water; but no vessel should ever attempt it, as the tide, both ebb and flood, sets with great force right on Nepean Reef.

*Marks to clear the "Corsair Rock."*

In working out between the Heads, keep the flagstaff on Observatory Point open half a cable's length with the lowest part of Nepean Point, until Shortland's Bluff flagstaff is half a cable's length open to the westward of the low light-

house; which latter mark must be kept on until you open out Nepean Rock to the eastward of that point, when you are out clear of the rock and Nepean Reef.

In working in between the Heads, keep Shortland's Bluff flagstaff half a cable's length open to the westward of the low lighthouse, until you have the flagstaff on Observatory Point half a cable's length open to the lowest part of Point Nepean, which will lead you clear of the "Corsair Rock;" but to clear Nepean Reef, which lies a cable's length inside the rock, do not shut in the low lighthouse with Shortland's Bluff flagstaff, until you open out the Nepean Rock to the westward of that point, when you are in clear of the reef.

1. All the articles required by this notice are to be of the best quality of their several kinds.

2. The flour and bread must be the produce of clean sound Colonial wheat, from which, on the rations of emigrants, surveying parties, border police, 20 per cent, and on the rations to prisoners of the Crown 10 per cent has been extracted in bran and waste.

3. Beef and mutton to be issued in such proportions as may be required, and, when the quantity admits of it, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately.

4. When it may be necessary to substitute one article for another, the following proportions are to be observed viz. :—

6. Forage may be tendered for separately.

7. The above substitutions are not to be made except on the requisitions of the officer authorised to draw the several rations.

8. Vegetables to be supplied in reasonable proportions of potatoes, greens, pumpkins, onions, &c., &c.

9. The supplies for road parties and surveying parties are to be delivered at the nearest fixed stations to the places where the party may be employed, on the requisition of the officer in charge.

10. The supplies (not specified in the preceding paragraphs) are to be delivered direct to the parties or establishment entitled thereto, on the written order of the person duly authorised for the purpose.

11. Provisions and forage, when required by rations, according to the scales under their respective heads, the tenders are to express the price per ration only.

15. In the event of any unnecessary delay or failure of the contractor to supply the articles when required, they will be otherwise procured, and charged in like manner.

16. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or from some other cause, injury would be sustained, either by the parties to whom the rations are due, or to the contractor by waiting for a Board of Survey, the Civil Commissariat Officer, the head of the department or Officer in charge of the party or parties for whom the rations are to be received, shall have the power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality; it being distinctly understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Governor, although in the meantime he must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer or party requiring it, and the expense charged to the contractor.



17. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of any delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report of the officer in charge of the parties or establishments, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth the amount of his monthly account, as the Governor may direct.
