*Regulations as to the discharge of Articled Seamen undergoing sentences under the Merchant Seaman's Act.*

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant Governor has been pleased to direct that the Regulations of the thirtieth day of November last shall be cancelled, and the following substituted.

1. Four clear days' notice of the discharge of all seamen undergoing magisterial sentences for breaches of the law applicable to merchant seamen shall be given by the gaoler or other person in whose custody they may be to the Master of the vessel (if still in port) to which such seamen may belong.

2. That any Master, desirous of obtaining the discharge of seamen belonging to his vessel before the expiration of their sentence, to enable him to proceed to sea, shall make a written application for such seamen's discharge to the superintendent of the penal department, by transmitting the same through the assistant superintendent of the hulk "Deborah" lying in Hobson's Bay, at least seven (7) clear days prior to the date on which he may desire to obtain such discharge, in order that His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor's sanction may be obtained to the same.

## PILOTAGE RATES.

*Act of Council 16 Vict. No. 12.*

Ships arriving at or departing from any of the Ports of the said Colony shall be charged a Pilotage Rate of three pence per ton, registered tonnage, such charge not to be more than fifteen pounds nor less than two pounds and ten shillings for Pilotage in the Port of Port-Albert, nor less than four pounds in any other Port of the said Colony. An additional Rate of one penny halfpenny per ton will be charged if a Pilot of the Ports of Melbourne or Geelong be taken outside a line between Points Nepean and Lonsdale, the whole of the Pilotage Rates in no case exceeding twenty pounds. Ships taking a Pilot between the Ports of Melbourne and Geelong shall be subject to half the first mentioned charges. Ships returning to port within forty-eight hours after having been piloted to sea, and ships towed, one-half only of the above Rates.

*Exemptions.*

- All ships outfitting to, or refitting from, the fisheries.
  - All ships employed in the coasting trade, and all ships regularly trading between any port of the said Colony of Victoria, and of any of the Colonies of New South Wales, Van Diemen's Land, New Zealand, Western and South Australia, and ships under fifty tons of register measurement, are exempt from Pilotage, unless the services of a Pilot shall have been actually required and received. If a Pilot be taken, the full rate of Pilotage shall be payable.

*Note.*—The above "Tariff," and "Pilotage Rates" are the only charges on goods and ships entering or departing from the Ports of Victoria.

## PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.—IMPRESTS.

IN reference to the fifteenth paragraph of the Regulations of the 1st of January, 1852, respecting Public Accounts, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor directs the publication of the following revised instructions relative to advances, to take effect on and after the 1st of March, 1853.

1. The term "Advance" is to be discontinued, and the term "Imprest" used in lieu thereof.
2. Heads of Departments and other Officers of the Government will have money imprested to them, from the Colonial Treasury, monthly, to enable them to defray, with due promptitude and regularity, expenses incurred for authorised services under their superintendence.
3. Officers, whose departments or duties are confined to Melbourne, Geelong, or Portland, will receive Imprests for contingencies and wages only.
4. Due Security will be required by the Government from all Officers who may receive Imprests, and also from all subordinate Officers whom it may be expedient to entrust with the custody or expenditure of any portion of such Imprests.
5. On or before the 25th instant, and thereafter, on the 25th of each month, such Officers as may be required to receive imprests will forward to the Audit Office, Melbourne, a statement in the annexed form, (A), showing the particulars of the salaries and contingencies to be defrayed by them in the ensuing month.
6. They will, at the same time, transmit complete accounts of the expenditure of the Imprests received by them for the service of the preceding month. These Accounts will consist of the Bills of particulars, together with Abstracts of the same (distinguishing Salaries and Contingencies), as shown in the annexed forms, (B), (1) and (2). In the event of it being found impracticable in any case to comply with this rule,

the Officer concerned will notify the circumstance in a letter to the Auditor General, and state at the same time the period within which the requisite Accounts will be furnished.

7. No Accounts will be entertained which are not prepared upon a printed Government form, and it will be incumbent on every Officer entrusted with the expenditure of an Imprest, to see that these forms are duly filled up, and that the Accounts are properly completed in accordance with the General Regulations of the Government, and with the particular directions printed on each form.

8. Expenses incurred for the service of a period for which an Imprest is made, must, if possible, be paid out of that Imprest. Should this course be found impracticable in any instance, the Head of Department is to notify the circumstance to the Auditor General when he forwards his adjustment accounts to that officer.

9. In all cases where a Head of Department may find it necessary to place public money in the hands of a subordinate, in order to enable him to pay weekly salaries or other expenses, a receipt must be taken from such subordinate for the amount; and he must be required to hand in accounts, in proper form, of his expenditure, immediately after the period of the services to be liquidated by him has expired, which period is in no case to exceed one week.

10. In the event of any subordinate Officer having failed to render his Accounts at the time when it is necessary for the Head of Department

to adjust his Imprest, the receipt of that subordinate is to be forwarded in lieu of such accounts, and a report must be appended by the Head of Department, stating full particulars of the defalcation.

11. No Officer will be allowed to pay his own Salary out of an Imprest made to him for the service of his department, neither will he be allowed to pay the Salaries of those whom he may entrust with the expenditure of any portion of the Imprest, until accounts of such expenditure have been duly rendered by them in the manner before laid down.

12. Every Officer receiving an Imprest will open an account with one of the Local Banks to be called his "Imprest Account," to which he will place every Imprest he may receive from the Colonial Treasury. On no account may a Public Imprest be blended with a private account. The particular Bank, in which each Imprest Account is opened, is to be communicated to the Colonial Treasurer and the Auditor General; and the former will notify to each Officer, whenever an Imprest has been placed to the credit of his Public Imprest Account.

13. The Auditor General, or other Officer duly authorised by the Lieutenant Governor, will be allowed free access, at all times, to every public Imprest Account, and will have power to call upon any Officer to adjust his Account; and, if requisite, will take the necessary steps for effecting a compulsory adjustment.

**W**HEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria,

intituled, "*An Act to make Provision for the Sale of Fermented and Spirituous Liquors, and of Refreshments in certain Districts,*" it was enacted that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony by Notice in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time to proclaim any part or portion of the said Colony to be a District subject to the provisions of that Act, to be called "*A Special Licensing District,*" and to define the boundaries of such District, Now I, the Lieutenant Governor aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said Colony, do hereby proclaim the following parts and portions of the said Colony to be "Special Licensing Districts" under the provisions of the said Act; and do hereby define the boundaries of the same to be as follows, that is to say: That part of the said Colony known as "The Northern Circuit District" the boundaries whereof are, the Great Dividing Range, being the southern boundary of the County of Talbot, commencing at the source of the River Avoca, thence along the Dividing Range aforesaid to the source of the River Coliban, thence by that River to its confluence with the River Campaspe, thence by the Rivers Campaspe and Murray to a point north of the north-western boundary of the township of Castle Donnington; thence by a line southward to Lake Bael Bael, and thence by the River Avoca to its source in the Dividing Range aforesaid, and also that portion of the said Colony known as the District of the County Court of Buninyong, the boundaries whereof are, the Great Dividing Range, being the northern boundary line of the County of Grant commencing at the source of the River Moorabool, thence along the Dividing Range aforesaid to the boundary of the County of Ripon, thence westerly along that boundary to Lake Burrambeet; thence by the northern boundary line of the County of Grenville to the Township of Carngham; thence by a straight line south-easterly to the junction of the River Yarrowee with Williamson's Creek; thence a straight line easterly to the junction of Lal Lal Rivulet with the River Moorabool aforesaid; and thence by that river to its source in the Dividing Range aforesaid; and also all that portion of the said Colony known as the Pastoral District of the Murray, the boundaries whereof are those set forth in the Schedule annexed to "*The Victoria Electoral Act of 1851,*" marked A. And also all that portion of the said Colony, which lies within one mile on either side of the main line of road leading from the City of Melbourne by Keilor, and also that by the Deep Creek to Gisborne, and thence by Kyneton, to and including the township of Malmesbury on the River Coliban. And also all that portion of the said Colony which lies within one mile of the main lines of road leading from the City of Melbourne by Bacchus Marsh and Ballan to Buninyong, and and from the town of Geelong by the River Leigh, and also by Sutherlands to Buninyong aforesaid. And also all that portion of the said Colony which lies within one mile of the main line of road leading from the City of Melbourne aforesaid to the said Pastoral District of the Murray by the towns of Kilmore and Seymour in the said Colony: And I do declare that no part of the said Colony within one mile of the Corporate

boundaries of the City of Melbourne or Town of Geelong, shall be deemed a Special Licensing District within the meaning of the said Act.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

**RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE  
NORTHERN, BUNINYONG, AND WEST-  
ERN COUNTY COURTS.**

WHEREAS pursuant to an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria made and passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "*An Act to make provision for the better Administration of Justice in County Courts in the Colony of Victoria*" (assented to 23rd September, 1852), His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* of the 5th day of January, 1853, established three several Local Courts, to be called respectively "The Northern County Court," "The County Court of Buninyong," and "The Western County Court," and defined the limits and boundaries of the jurisdiction of the same respectively, and whereas it is amongst other things enacted in the said Act, "That it shall be lawful for the Judge of any County Court from time to time to make and prescribe such Rules and Regulations touching and concerning the forms of process and pleading, the taking the examination of witnesses and allowing the same as evidence, the mode of executing all process of the Court, the admission of counsel and attorneys, the fees to be lawfully demanded in such Court or by the attorneys practising therein, and the practise and manner of proceeding in all actions to be brought therein, and all other matters and things whatsoever for the conduct and dispatch of business in such Court as he may deem applicable and advantageous, and such Rules from time to time to amend, alter, or revoke: Provided however that every such Rule should be forwarded by the said Judge to the Prothonotary or other proper officer of the Supreme Court of the said Colony, to be by him laid before the Judges of such Court, who shall have power to allow or disallow the same; and no such Rule or Regulation shall have effect until it shall have been published in the *Government Gazette*; and every Rule when so allowed and published as aforesaid, shall have the like force and effect as if the same had been inserted in this Act." In pursuance of such power the following Rules and Regulations are made and prescribed by Arthur Nicholas Wrixon, Esq., Judge of such Courts, and allowed by their Honors the Judges of the Supreme Court of the said Colony.

**No. 1.**

The Schedule of Fees and Scale of Fees hereunto annexed shall form part of these Rules.

No. 8.—FEBRUARY 16TH, 1853.—10.

**No. 2.—Forms to be used.**

The Forms shall be used as far as they may be applicable, but may be modified to meet the circumstances of each case.

**No. 3.—Undeferred cases above £10.**

At the hearing of cases where the amount sought to be recovered shall exceed £10, the undefended cases will be heard first, and according to their number in the Cause Book.

**No. 4.—Actions to be classified.**

Actions shall be divided into two classes: Actions on Contract; and, Actions for Wrong.

All technical distinctions of Forms of Action under each respective class shall be unnecessary; and the term "Damages" shall be held to include Debt, or Demand, as well as Damage, or Damages.

**No. 5.—Clear Days.**

In computation of time, Days shall be interpreted to mean Clear Days, and Sundays and Holidays shall be counted, unless it be required that any act be performed on such days, in which case such act shall be done on the day following any such Sunday or Holiday.

**No. 6.—Plaint. Summons and Service.**

In all cases the Plaints shall be entered at least fourteen days, and the Summons issuing thereupon shall be served together with a Copy of the Plaint and particulars at least ten days prior to the day appointed for the sitting of the Court.

**No. 7.—Mileage to be paid.**

No Summons or Process shall be served by the Bailiff of the Court unless the Mileage Fees, where payable, shall have been previously paid into court by the party suing out the same.

**No. 8.—Service on Soldiers or Marines.**

When the Defendant shall be living or serving on board any Ship or Vessel, or quartered in any Barracks or Cantonment within the jurisdiction of the Court, or serving Her Majesty as a Soldier, Sailor, or Marine, it shall be sufficient to deliver the Summons or other process of the Court to the senior Officer on board, or to the person who may at the time appear to have charge of such Ship or Vessel, or to the Adjutant of the Corps, or any Officer or Sergeant of the Company to which such Soldier or Marine shall belong or be attached.

**No. 9.—Initial of Christian Name.**

If the Initial only of the Christian name of any person be known to either party to any action, it shall be sufficient in any process or pleading to describe such person by the Initial and by his surname.

**No. 10.—Assignees, &c., to be sued as Parties.**

The character of Trustees or of Trustees or Assignees of an Insolvent or Bankrupt, or of Executor or of Administrator, or of persons authorised by Act of Parliament or Council to sue and be sued as nominal parties, shall be taken to be admitted unless denied by plea in writing.

**No. 11.—Partners how sued.**

If Two or more persons jointly sued be partners in trade, service on any one shall be sufficient.

**No. 12.—Defences.**

Defences or Pleas shall be filed five days before the time appointed for the Sitting of the Court, and in cases in which money is paid into Court by Defendant, it must be paid in at the time of filing the Defence or Plea.

No. 13.—*Plea of Tender not to avail without Payment.*

A Plea of Tender before action brought shall not avail as a Defence unless the amount be paid into Court.

No. 14.—*Payment admitted.*

Payment admitted by Plaintiff's Bill of Particulars need not be pleaded.

No. 15.—*Plea denying Handwriting to be sworn to.*

It shall not be necessary for the Plaintiff to prove the Handwriting of any party to a Bill of Exchange or Promissory Note, Deed, Agreement or Contract in writing made the subject of Plaintiff unless the handwriting be denied by Plea, and every such Plea must be accompanied by an affidavit of the truth thereof.

No. 16.—*Cases to be called on as entered.*

At each Sitting of the Court, Numerical Lists of the Cases, undefended and defended, shall be prepared by the Registrar of the Court, such List to be kept according to the time and order in which the Summonses are taken out; and each Plaintiff shall be required to attend and prosecute his suit at the time and in the order in which his case is called on for hearing.

No. 17.—*Motion for New Trial.*

No motion for a New Trial will be entertained unless notice is given of intention to move before rising of the Court.

No. 18.—*Record Book to be kept.*

The Registrar shall keep a Record Book for causes under £10, and a Record Book for causes exceeding £10, which Books he shall always have in Court upon the trial of the causes, and in which he shall enter all proceedings in the several actions; and also a Cash Book and an Order Book, in which shall be kept a distinct account of all proceedings.

No. 19.—*Material Witness. Postponement.*

If it shall appear to the Court upon oath that any person who is a material witness for either party in any case, doth not attend at the hearing thereof, and that reasonable diligence has been exercised in endeavouring to procure his attendance, the Judge shall at his discretion and upon such terms as he may deem fit, either postpone the hearing to another day then to be appointed by him, or else shall take the examination of such witnesses as appear, and suspend the further hearing of the case to another day.

No. 20.—*Examination of Witnesses "de bene esse."*

Examination of Witnesses *de bene esse* may be taken at any time after plea filed either before the Judge or by the Registrar as may be ordered in each case.

No. 21.—*Interest.*

When the Judgment shall be upon a debt payable with Interest thereon, Interest may be given up to the day of the date of the judgment of the Court, such Interest being calculated at a rate not exceeding 8 per cent.

No. 22.—*Execution of Process. Levy to whom to be paid.*

In every case of an Execution for damages and costs, or for costs only, and of the same respectively being paid to the Registrar, the amount shall be, on demand, paid out by such Registrar to the order of the Suitor to whom the same was

awarded, if he shall not have had an attorney, and in such case to the order of such attorney only, and not to the party or his order.

No. 23.—*Execution when to be sued out.*

There shall be two days between the last day of the sitting of the Court and the day on which a party shall be entitled to take out a Writ of Execution, unless the Judge shall certify under his hand that in his opinion execution ought to issue forthwith.

No. 24.—*Goods levied out of Town. Mode of proceeding.*

When any goods are levied upon, in any place not being situated in or being part of any town, the bailiff shall if required by the person whose goods are being levied upon, and on payment of the expense of removal by such person, remove the goods so levied upon to the next town for sale, and in all cases of any sale not being conducted in a town, the bailiff shall post a written notice of such intended sale at the Court House or some convenient public place in the next town, two days previous to such sale taking place.

No. 25.

Notice of intention to apply to revive any judgment, decree or order shall be served, and the service thereof proved within the like time, and in like manner respectively as summonses under rule No. 6.

No. 26.—*When Original shown.*

It shall not be necessary to the service of any notice, summons, particulars, order or rule, that the original should be shown, unless sight thereof be demanded, except in cases where it may be necessary to proceed by attachment.

No. 27.—*Special Summonses.*

No Special Summonses shall be issued without an affidavit, and every summons or notice shall contain a note of the objection or matter intended to be supported at the hearing.

No. 28.—*Service of Special Summonses.*

Special Summons and Notices shall be served one day before the time appointed for the hearing of the matter therein stated.

No. 29.—*Attornies.*

In all cases in which a party appears by Attorney without Counsel, the Attorney shall conduct the case in person, and not by his Clerk or another Attorney.

No. 30.—*Attornies. Filing Bill of Costs.*

Every Attorney at the time of filing his Bill of Costs shall give notice to the opposite party, or his Attorney, if he appear by one, that he will within two days (stating the day and hour), proceed to tax the same before the Registrar of the Court, and should such party or his Attorney neglect to attend at such taxation, the Registrar shall tax the Bill.

It shall be lawful, however, for the Judge at any time on reasonable cause shown, to order a review of or fresh taxation of costs, either generally or in respect of particular terms.

No. 31.—*Searches.*

Parties shall be at liberty by themselves or their Attornies to search the Registrar's Office, and to take any copy of such parts of the proceeding as relates to their own causes.
