His Excellency the Governor General directs the publication, for general information, of the subjoined notice, containing a description of the Light which has been established at Gabo Island, Ingue which has been established at Gabo Island, and which he has been pleased to designate the "Flinders Light," in honor of the late Captain Matthew Flinders, Royal Navy, and in testimony of the eminent services rendered by him to the Australian Colonies by the numerous hydrographical surveys which he made of the Coast and Harbors.

FLINDERS LIGHT, GABO ISLAND. The Lighthouse on Gabo Island, off Cape Howe, is situated in

No. 10 .- February 3rd, 1854 .- 2.

Latitude......... 37° 34′ 20″ South. Longitude....... 149° 54′ 40″ East.

It was completed and lighted on the 28th November, 1853, and a light will in future be exhibited from sunset to sunrise.

The Lighthouse is a skeleton timber erection, painted white; the roof and framing of the Lantern painted red; and the Ventilating Ball painted yellow.

It stands nearly in the centre of the Island, about three-quarters of a mile from its southern point, upon a sand hill 157ft. 6in. above the sea. The centre of the Light is 21ft. 6in. above the sand, making a total of 179ft. above the sea.

The following Magnetic Bearings are taken from the Lighthouse:-

Cape Howe ...... N. 32° E. Ram Head..... S.W.

Variation of Compass...... 11° E. The Light is a Fixed White Light of the First Class, consisting of 24 Catoptric Lamps in 2 ranges, illuminating the whole horizon.

The Light is eclipsed by a small range of sand hills from S. 15° E. to S. 4° W. (in all 19 degrees), to a distance averaging about 2 miles out to sea.

It is estimated that the Light can be seen 20 miles distant in clear weather.

CLAUSE VI .- " If any iron, timber, or other " bulky article be left on any public quay, after "twenty-four hours notice to remove the same "shall have been given by the Port Officer, Har-bor Master, or proper Officer of Customs, to " the owner or person in charge thereof, it shall " be lawful for any two Justices of the Peace, on " proof of such notice having been given, to issue " their warrant for removing such iron, timber, " or articles, and for selling the same after the " expiration of five days from the removal thereof, "and out of the proceeds of such sale to defray " the expenses of such removal and sale, paying "the surplus (if any) to such owner or person entitled thereto. And if no owner of such "iron, timber, or article can be found, and " there be no person in charge thereof, and " such iron, timber, or article shall remain on " any quay for the space of four days, the "Port Officer, Harbor Master, or proper " Officer of Customs may remove the same to " some convenient warehouse or place at the "risk and expense of the owner or person in " charge, such expense to be recovered as herein"after mentioned."

CLAUSE XXV .- "The term quay shall be " taken to mean any pier, jetty, quay, wharf, or "landing place."

# RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE SUPREME COURT OF THE COLONY OF VICTORIA.

In the Supreme Court of \ the Colony of Victoria. }

Tuesday, the 29th day of November, A.D. 1853.

N pursuance of the power given to their Honors the Judges of the Supreme Court by the Act 15 Victoria, No. 10, intituled, "An Act to make provision for the better Administration of "Justice in the Colony of Victoria," it is ordered that from and after the first day of February next, which will be in the year of our Lord 1854, the Rules of Practice now in force in the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria shall be repealed, and that instead thereof the following (among others) shall be substituted: Provided that all actions, suits, and other proceedings then depending in the said Court shall be continued and concluded under the Rules now in force.

## CHAPTER XI.

That the scale of fees, costs, and charges set forth in the Schedule to these Rules annexed, shall be those established, so far as the same can be applied, and the proper officers shall tax and allow all bills of costs in accordance therewith; and for all business not comprehended therein, the like fees, costs, and charges as are established by law or sanctioned by usage in the several superior

Courts of England for the conduct of such business, shall be allowed.

2. That the costs in Equity, Ecclesiastical proceedings, and in Conveyancing, shall be taxed by the Master in Equity; in Insolvency, by the Chief Commissioner of Insolvent Estates; and in Common Law and in Criminal proceedings, by the Prothonotary or such other officer as the

3. That application for security for costs be, in ordinary cases, made before plea, and in other cases, within a reasonable time after the absence of the plaintiff has come to the knowledge of the defendant.

On amendment.

Security for Costs

4. That whenever any amendment is allowed, or rule or order enlarged, upon payment of costs, payment of such costs shall be a condition precedent to the progress of the action, suit, or matter, or hearing of the rule or order.

Costs of Rule of Order.

5. That whenever any rule or order is made absolute or granted, and no mention of costs is made by the Court or a Judge, such rule or order shall be drawn up with costs to be paid to

the successful party.

6. That where notice of an intended motion is given, or where cause is to be shewn in the first instance after notice against a rule or order, and the party who may have given such notice or who intended to move for such rule or order shall not appear, but the party served with notice or prepared to show cause do appear, the Court may at its rising, on production of the notice, make order that the costs of the party so appearing be paid by the party who gave such notice.

And if both parties appear and the party who shews cause be successful, the Court may

order that his costs be paid in like manner.

7. That where a new trial is granted without any mention of costs, the costs of the first

trial shall not be allowed to the successful party, although he succeed on the second trial.

8. That the taxing officers may in their discretion allow in all cases, as between party and party, the fees of counsel for drawing pleadings or other proceedings, whether special or otherwise, and for advising.

9. That the taxing officers shall allow in the costs of briefs to counsel only for copying into such briefs of such documents or parts of documents as they may in their discretion consider necessary for the instruction of counsel, or for use at any trial or hearing.

10. That if a plaintiff in ejectment be nonsuited at trial, the defendant shall be entitled to

his costs of suit.

11. That no person admitted to sue in forma pauperis shall, in any case, be entitled to costs from the opposite party unless by order of a Court or a Judge.

12. That when two or more writs, summonses, orders, or notices, in the same cause or matter, can be served at the same time on any plaintiff or defendant, they shall be so served, and when such is the case, mileage shall be allowed for the service of one only.

13. That any number of names of witnesses may be inserted in a subpœna, and the costs

of only one original will be allowed. 14. That whenever it shall appear to the Master in Equity that it is just that the costs, or any part of the costs, of any attendance or proof before him, or of costs incurred through nonattendance, should be paid specially by any party or claimant, he may award payment thereof.
