To our trusty and well-beloved the Honorable WILLIAM FOSTER STAWELL, Attorney-General of Our Colony of Victoria; the Honorable JAMES FREDERICK PALMER, Speaker of the Legislative Council of our said Colony; ANDREW CLARKE, Esquire, Captain of our Corps of Royal Engineers and Surveyor General of our said Colony; CHARLES JAMES GRIFFITH, Esquire, President of the Commissioners of Sewerage and Water Supply; and JOHN O'SHANASSY, JAMES FORD STRACHAN, JOHN PASCOE FAWKNER, WILLIAM NICHOLSON, WILLIAM CLERK HAINES, CHARLES BRADSHAW, and WILLIAM FORLONGE, Esquires, Members of the Legislative Council of our said Colony:

GREETING,—

Whereas it is deemed expedient that enquiry should be made into the laws and usages now existing, by virtue of which the Waste Lands of the Crown in our Colony of Victoria are occupied, and into the effect thereof upon the settlement and well-being of our said Colony; and further, that any alterations in such laws and usages which may seem necessary for the public advantage and convenience should be ascertained; and that the nature and extent of all claims which may have arisen under such laws and usages should be investigated, and such claims adjusted and determined: Now KNOW YE, that we, confiding much in your fidelity, knowledge, and ability, do, by these presents, nominate, constitute, and appoint you, our trusty and well-beloved WILLIAM FOSTER STAWELL, JAMES FREDERICK PALMER, ANDREW CLARKE, CHARLES JAMES GRIFFITH, JOHN O'SHANASSY, JAMES FORD STRACHAN, JOHN PASCOE FAWKNER, WILLIAM NICHOLSON, WILLIAM CLERK HAINES, CHARLES BRADSHAW, and WILLIAM FORLONGE, to be our Commissioners for the purposes herein mentioned: And we do, by these presents grant unto you full power and authority to enquire into the laws and usages now existing, by virtue of which the Waste Lands of the Crown in our said Colony of Victoria are occupied, and into the effect thereof upon the settlement and well-being of our said Colony, and further to recommend such alterations in those laws and usages as may seem necessary for the public advantage and convenience, and also to ascertain the nature and extent of all claims which may have arisen under such laws and usages, and the best and most equitable mode of adjusting and determining such claims: And we do, by these presents, grant unto you, our said Commissioners, as far as in us lies, power and authority to call before you such persons by whom you may be the better informed upon the

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subject of this our Commission, and also to call for, have access to, and examine all such books, documents, registers, and records as may afford the fullest information on the subject, and to enquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever: And for your further assistance in the execution of the premises, we do hereby appoint our trusty and well-beloved TRAVERS ADAMSON, Esquire, to be Secretary to this our Commission, whose services you may use from time to time as occasion may require: And we hereby direct and appoint that you do report to us in writing, under your hands and seals your proceedings, and also your opinions on the subject herein referred to you: And lastly, we do, by these presents, ordain that this our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, our said Commissioners, or any Five or more of you, shall and may, from time to time, proceed in the execution thereof and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

Witness, our trusty and well-beloved SIR CHARLES HOTHAM, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Military Order of the Bath, Lieutenant Governor of our Colony of Victoria, at the Government Offices, in Melbourne, in our said Colony, this second day of November, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, and in the eighteenth year of our Reign.

## PORTLAND STOCKADE.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HOTHAM, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Military Order of the Bath, Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act to make provision for the better controul and disposal of Offenders," it was amongst other things enacted, That all buildings, erections, houses, and premises thereafter to be erected, built, purchased, enlarged or maintained at the public expense, as and for Public Gaols, Prisons, Houses of Correction, and Penal Establishments within the said Colony, which should from time to time be proclaimed as such by the Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony, by notice in the *Government Gazette* should be Public Gaols, Prisons, Houses of Correction, or Penal Establishments respectively, of the place or district where the same are or shall be situate, within the said Colony, and should be subject to the several provisions made for the regulation, discipline, management, and care of the Public Gaols, Prisons, Houses of Correction, and Penal Establishments already erected in the said Colony, and of the Prisoners confined within the same: And whereas it is expedient that a certain piece or parcel of land lying and being in the parish of Portland, in the county of Normandy, hereinafter described, with certain erections thereon, should be, and be declared to be, a Stockade, or Prison, House of Correction, and Penal Establishment: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony, by virtue of the said recited Act, do hereby proclaim and declare, that a certain piece or parcel of enclosed land lying and being in the parish of Portland, in the county of Normandy, containing fifty-one acres three roods, part of allotment 8 of section 3, being the Stockade reserve; and bounded on the east by a road three chains wide, bearing south 6 degrees, east 13 chains 33 links, and south 70 degrees east 6 chains 28 links; on the south by allotments 46 and 45, a road one chain wide, and allotment 47, bearing south 83 degrees west 42 chains; on the west by a line bearing north 7 degrees west 12 chains; and on the north by a line bearing north 76 degrees 30 minutes, east 31 chains 60 links, and a road one chain wide, bearing north 74 degrees east 5 chains 20 links, with all erections and buildings at the south-east corner of the piece or parcel of land above described, shall be a Stockade, or Prison, House of Correction, and Penal Establishment, for the district of Portland, in the said Colony.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HOTHAM, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Military Order of the Bath, Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor General and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the fourteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, called "The Victoria Electoral Act of 1851," it was amongst other things enacted, that the places for taking the poll at elections in the several Electoral Districts should be those specified in the schedule annexed to the now reciting Act; and it was provided that such other places should be polling places for the said Electoral Districts as should be appointed for that purpose by the Governor, by any Proclamation to be issued by him in that behalf, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the Colony; And whereas it is deemed expedient to constitute an additional polling place for the Electoral District of the United Counties of Ripon, Hampden, Grenville, and Polwarth: Now I, the Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the said recited Act, do hereby proclaim and appoint the undermentioned place to be a polling place for the Electoral District specified in connection therewith, in addition to the polling places appointed by the said Act:—  
The Electoral District of the United Counties of RIPON, HAMPDEN, GRENVILLE, and POLWARTH—WINCHELSEA, in the county of Grant.

9. The supplies (not specified in the preceding paragraphs) are to be delivered direct to the parties or establishment entitled thereto, on the written order of the person duly authorised for the purpose.



10. Provisions, when required by rations, according to the scales under their respective heads, the tenders are to express the price per ration only.

11. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the party receiving the supplies, as to the quality, the same is to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a Board of Survey, according to the practice of the service. But, in country districts, where a Board of Survey cannot be conveniently assembled, the party objecting will name one person as arbitrator, the contractor or his agent another, and these two will (previously to any other proceeding on their part) concur in naming a third as umpire, who, in the event of the arbitrators not agreeing in opinion, will be called upon for his decision, which shall be final.

12. If the Board, arbitrators, or umpire shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured by the party requiring it, and the expense charged to the contractor.

13. In the event of any unnecessary delay or failure of the contractors to supply the articles when required, they will be otherwise procured, and charged in like manner.

14. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or from some other cause, injury would be sustained, either by the parties to whom the rations are due, or to the contractor by waiting for a Board of Survey, the Civil Commissariat Officer, the head of the department or officer in charge of the party or parties for whom the rations are to be received, shall have the power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality; it being distinctly understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Governor, although in the meantime he must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer or party requiring it, and the expense charged to the contractor.

15. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of any delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report of the officer in charge of the parties or establishments, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth the amount of his monthly account, as the Governor may direct. It will also be in the power of the Governor, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

16. It will be in the power of either party to limit the duration of the contract, by giving in writing a notice of three full calendar months to the opposite party, to end the contract at the expiration of that period, it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the contract is made or agreed to be made.

17. The contractor will be required to prepare his own account monthly or quarterly, in the prescribed form; and on the production thereof, with the requisite vouchers, in a complete state, to the Civil Commissary General, or Assistant Civil Commissary of the district, for examination, they will be forwarded to the Audit Office, and payment will be made through the Colonial Treasury.

20. The tenders are required to have attached to them the signatures of the party or parties willing to supply the Government with the articles enumerated, as also the names of the persons proposed as sureties for the due fulfilment of their contracts, stating fully the addresses or residence.

21. All tenders to be enclosed in a separate envelope, and marked, "Tender for Provisions, &c.," and to be deposited in a box marked "Tender," at the Civil Commissariat Office, Great Bourke-street west; or by post, addressed to the Civil Commissary General.

22. The tenders must include the whole of the rations and separate articles abovementioned.

23. Tenders for each *locality* or *station* to be separate.

24. Parties willing to supply the Government either in the city of Melbourne and its environs, or at the different stations above enumerated, may obtain every information at the Civil Commissariat Office, in Bourke-street west, or of the Assistant Civil Commissaries stationed at Geelong and Belfast.
