PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Charles Hotham, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Military Order of the Bath, Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c.,

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the twelfth day of August, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, it was amongst other things directed that all ships and vessels arriving in this Colony from or having touched at any port or place in California, and all boats belonging to the said ships and vessels, and all boats having received any person or thing from such ships and vessels, and all persons, goods, wares, merchandise, and other articles and things whatsoever coming or brought in or being on board such ships, vessels, and boats, should in every case perform quarantine for a period of not less than two days: Now I, the Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation so far as the same affects any ships, vessels, boats, and persons and things on board thereof, arriving from or having touched at any port or place in California aforesaid.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-ninth day of November, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, and in the eighteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
