MARTIAL LAW IN THE BUNINYONG DISTRICT REVOKED FROM 9TG DECEMBER.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir Charles Hotham, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Military Order of the Bath, Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria and under the Seal of the said Colony bearing date the Fourth day of December, A.D. 1854, reciting amongst other things that Bodies of Armed Men had arrayed themselves against Her Majesty's Forces and the Constituted Authorities, and had committed acts of open rebellion, it was commanded and proclaimed that from and after Twelve of the clock at Noon on Wednesday, the Sixth day of the said month of December, Martial Law should and might be administered and executed against every person and persons within the limits thereinafter described, and which limits included the Gold Fields of Ballaarat, who should at any time after the said hour commit any act of rebellion, any treason, treasonable or seditious practices or other outrage or misdemeanor whatever within the said limits.

And whereas information has been received from the General Officer Commanding Her Majesty's Forces within the said limits that the population engaged on the said Gold Fields have returned to their usual avocations, and the commission of the said offences having been suppressed, it is therefore expedient that the said recited Proclamation should, from the time hereinafter mentioned, be revoked.

Now I, the Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby declare and proclaim that from and after the hour of Twelve of the Clock at Noon on Saturday, the Ninth day of December, now instant, the said recited Proclamation shall be, and the same is hereby revoked; And I do hereby, with the advice aforesaid, notify this my Proclamation to all subjects of Her Majesty in the said Colony of Victoria.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this Sixth day of December, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, and in the eighteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

LICENSES TO WORK COAL FIELDS. PPLICATION having been made to the Government by Charles Black, Esquire, on belialf of Richard Davis and John Watkins, the reputed discoverers of a workable coal field in the vicinity of Cape Paterson, for a lease of such portion of land in that locality as may lead to a thorough test of the usefulness of the discovery, and some doubt having arisen as to the power of the Local Government to grant more than annual licenses, and that such licenses should be offered by auction, the Lieutenant Governor has been pleased, pending the decision of the Right Honorable the Secretary of State (to whom application has been made respecting the leasing of mineral lands not auriferous), and with a view to determine without delay the actual benefit of this discovery, to order that annual licenses to occupy the sections of lands hereafter described and said to contain coal shall be put up to auction at an upset price of £10 per section.

The purchaser of the section now in the occupation of the said Charles Black shall pay over to the present occupant the value of his improvements, the amount whereof will be notified in the Government Gazette prior to sale.

At the expiration of the annual license, should the occupant be dispossessed by another licensee, an amount equal to the value of the improvements actually made by him, bona fide in working for coal, shall be paid by the in-coming occupant to the person so dispossessed—such amount in case of dispute to be ascertained by two competent persons, one to be appointed by the person dispossessed, and the other by the Government, and in case of their differing, to be decided by an umpire, appointed by the said arbitrators.

Directions for entering Port Frederick, on the River Mersey, in Van Diemen's Land.

When approaching from the westward or from the northward, vessels will first see the high land over the River Don—a high bluff, with cultivated land on the east side of it, with a patch of redearth to seewer! earth to seaward.

The Mersey Bluff bears E.S.E. by compass from the Don 2½ miles, a bold front, with deep water to within half a mile seaward.

To enter the River Mersey, keep the Don Bluff open of the Mersey Bluff half a mile, until you bring two white beacons on the western bank of the river in one. By keeping these beacons in one, the vessel will be taken to the eastward of the white buoy upon the shoal on the western end of the bar. A large tree, stripped of its branches and painted white, forms one of the beacons; the other, also painted white, is fixed upon sleepers on the bank of the river people a small where on the bank of the river, near a smaller beacon with a pointer on it, which has been placed upon the Muscle Rock. When the vessel is near the latter, which must not be approached too near, she will, by keeping the west side of the river on board, go safe to her anchorage. board, go safe to her anchorage

Vessels approaching from the eastward, after passing Port Sorell, will observe Wright's Island 7½ miles to the westward of Port Sorell, and 4 miles to the eastward of the Mersey Bluff. This island has a dangerous reef, known as the "Horse Shoe Reef," extending a mile to the northward, upon which the sea breaks with great violence. Vessels must pass to the northward, giving them

a good berth.
