NATIONAL EDUCATION.

THE following General Rule, made by the Commissioners of National Education, has been approved of by the Lieutenant Governor, and is now published, pursuant to the Act of Council, 15 Victoria No. 7, sec. 6.

RESOLVED—That the local patrons of each school be informed that religious instruction in the school or class room, but not during the hours of secular instruction, may be imparted by the teacher in conformity with the Regulations of the Commissioners, if the local patrons, in writing, consent to such arrangement; provided that this Rule shall in no way authorize the teacher, either in or out of school, to act as a minister in connection with any denomination, and that in the event of any abuse of this permission the Commissioners will at once require the removal of the Teacher.

River Murray, for the purposes of the said Act:
Now I, the Lieutenant Governor of the said
Colony, by virtue of the authority in me vested
by the said recited Act, and of all and every other
power enabling me in this behalf, do hereby ap-
point the Township Reserve of Belvoir, in the said
Colony of Victoria, situate and being on the shore
of the River Murray aforesaid, opposite to the Town
of Albury, situate in the adjacent Colony of
New South Wales, to be a Port of Entry and
Clearance: And further, I do hereby define and
appoint that the limits of the said Port of Bel-
voir shall be as follow, that is to say:—Com-
mencing at a point three chains due south from
the south-west angle of the General Cemetery at
Belvoir, bounded on the south by a line bearing
east one hundred and sixty chains; on the east by
a line bearing north one hundred and four
chains, crossing the Wodonga Creek to the River
Murray; on the north by the River Murray to a
point due north from the south-west angle of the
General Cemetery; and thence on the east by a
