VACCINATION DISTRICTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HOTHAM, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Military Order of the Bath, Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to make compulsory the practice of "Vaccination," it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to divide the Colony

of Victoria into convenient Districts, for the purpose of affording facilities for Vaccination, and to appoint a convenient place in each such District, which should, in all practicable cases, be not more than three miles from the furthest limit thereof, for the performance of such Vaccination: Now I, the Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony, in furtherance of the provisions of the said Act, do hereby proclaim and appoint the Districts hereinafter named to be Districts for the purpose of affording facilities for Vaccination, that is to say:—

In the County of Bourke, the Districts of Brighton, Brunswick, Campbellfield, Collingwood, Flemington, Hawthorn, Melbourne, North Melbourne, Prahran, St. Kilda, Sandridge and Emerald Hill, Yarra Bend, Richmond, Williamstown.

In the County of Grant, the Districts of Ballaarat, Creswick's Creek, Geelong, Buninyong, Queenscliff.

In the County of Villiers, the District of Belfast.

In the County of Normanby, the District of Portland.

In the County of Dalhousie, the Districts of Kilmore, Kyneton, and Heathcote.

In the Pastoral District of the Loddon, the Districts of Avoca and Sandhurst.

In the Pastoral District of the Murray, the District of Beechworth.

In the County of Mornington, the District of Point Nepean.

LICENSES TO WORK COAL FIELDS.

APPLICATION having been made to the Government by Charles Black, Esquire, on behalf of Richard Davis and John Watkins, the reputed discoverers of a workable coal field in the vicinity of Cape Paterson, for a lease of such portion of land in that locality as may lead to a thorough test of the usefulness of the discovery, and some doubt having arisen as to the power of the Local Government to grant more than annual licenses, and that such licenses should be offered by auction, the Lieutenant Governor has been pleased, pending the decision of the Right Honorable the Secretary of State (to whom application has been made respecting the leasing of mineral lands not auriferous), and with a view to determine without delay the actual benefit of this discovery, to order that annual licenses to occupy the sections of lands hereafter described and said to contain coal shall be put up to auction at an upset price of £10 per section.

The purchaser of the section now in the occupation of the said Charles Black shall pay over to the present occupant the value of his improvements, the amount whereof will be notified in the *Government Gazette* prior to sale.

At the expiration of the annual license, should the occupant be dispossessed by another licensee, an amount equal to the value of the improvements actually made by him, *bona fide* in working for coal, shall be paid by the incoming occupant to the person so dispossessed—such amount in case of dispute to be ascertained by two competent persons, one to be appointed by the person dispossessed, and the other by the Government, and in case of their differing, to be decided by an umpire, appointed by the said arbitrators.

BOUNDARIES OF SECTIONS.

SECTION 29.

Commencing at a point on the sea coast near Cape Paterson, where the Coal Creek enters the sea, thence on the south by the sea coast in a westerly direction to a road one chain wide, which is the eastern boundary of section 16; on the west by that road bearing north 43 chains; on the north by a line bearing west 79 chains; on

the east by a road one chain wide bearing south 90 chains 50 links to the sea coast; and again on the south by the sea coast to the mouth of Coal Creek, the commencing point, containing 482 acres, more or less, and known as section 29, parish unnamed, county of Mornington.
