PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency CHARLES JOSEPH LA TROBE, Esquire, Lieutenant Governor in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies,

&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Colonial
Legislature of New South Wales, passed in the second year of the Roign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "An Act for regu-"lating the Police in the Towns of Parra-" matta, Windsor, Mailland, Bathurst, and " other Towns respectively, and for remov-"ing and preventing Nuisances and Obstruc-"tions, and for the better alignment of Streets therein," and by another Act of the Colonial Legislature of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the same Reign, to amend the abovementioned Act, the Lieutenant Governor is authorized, with the advice of the Executive Council, . to extend the operation of the said Acts to Cities, Towns, and places, by proclamation in the Govern-ment Gazette, and to define the limits of such places: Now therefore I, Charles Joseph La Trobe, the Lieutenant Governor aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare and appoint that the said Acts shall extend to and be in force in the Township of Wangaratta, in the said Colony of Victoria, and that the boundaries of the said Township shall be as follow, that is to say:—Commencing at the southwest angle of suburban allotment 1 of section 17, and bounded by lines bearing west about 121 chains, crossing the river King and the One Mile Creek; thence north 121 chains, again crossing the One Mile Creek; thence east 121 chains, crossing the river Ovens and a branch of the Reedy Creek; and south 121 chains to the commencing

point, crossing the river Ovens.

Section 46.—" That if any person, whether "employed in the Post Office, or otherwise, shall "fraudulently take from the possession of any "Postmaster, or person employed to convey post letters, or from out of any Post Office, or place appointed for the receipt or delivery of post letters, any letter or packet, or mail of letters, or any matter or thing enclosed in any such letter, packet, or mail (sent or to be sent by such post), or shall fraudulently take any letter or packet, or any matter or thing enclosed therein, out of such bag or mail, every such person so offending shall be deemed guilty of felony, and on conviction thereof shall be liable to be imprisoned with or without hard labour, or if a male, to be worked on the roads or other public works of the said Colony, for such term not exceeding fourteen years, as the "Court shall award."
