PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency CHARLES JOSEPH LA TROBE,
Esquire, Lieutenant Governor of the Colony
of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "*An Act to make provision for the better control and disposal of Offenders*," it is amongst other things enacted, That all buildings, erections, houses and premises thereafter to be erected, built, purchased, enlarged or maintained at the public expense as and for public Gaols, Prisons, Houses of Correction and Penal Establishments within the said Colony, which should from time to time be proclaimed by the Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, as such public Gaols, Prisons, Houses of Correction, or Penal Establishments, should, from and after the publication of such notice be severally deemed and taken to be the public Gaols, Prisons, Houses of Correction, and Penal Establishments respectively of the place or district where the same were or should be situated within the said Colony and should be subject to the several provisions made for the regulation, discipline, management, and care of the public Gaols, Prisons, Houses of Correction and Penal Establishments already erected in the said Colony, and of the prisoners confined within the same; And whereas it is expedient that a certain building, situate, lying, and being at Wangaratta, in the said Colony of Victoria, used and known as a Watchhouse, should be and be declared to be a Prison, House of Correction, and Penal Establishment: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant Governor aforesaid, by virtue of the said recited Act, and in furtherance of the power and authority thereby in me vested, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim, declare, and notify the certain building, situate, lying, and being at Wangaratta aforesaid, used and

known as a Watchhouse, to be a Prison, House of Correction, and Penal Establishment.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-third day of February, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight and fifty-four, and in the seventeenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

ROAD FROM MOUNT ALEXANDER ROAD TO SOLOMON'S FORD.

NOTICE is hereby given that a Map and Survey Plan, describing the exact course and bearings of, and the admeasurements required for, a new Road proposed to be made by the Central Road Board in the line of road leading from the Mount Alexander Road to Solomon's Ford, together with a description of the lands through which the same is proposed to pass, and the names of the owners and occupiers thereof, so far as they are known, and also an estimate of the expense of the said work, have been deposited in the Office of the Surveyor General, Melbourne.

The new road will commence where the present road terminates, at the eastern boundary of section No. 12, Parish of Doutta Galla; thence running westerly 27 chains, and passing through the properties of Messrs. Miller and McKlusky and Mr. Dugald McPhail; thence running north 81 deg., west 3 chains 25 links; thence running north 73 deg., west 12 chains 50 links, and passing through the property of Mr. Dugald McPhail; thence running south 80 deg., west 25 chains; and thence running south 74 deg., west 15 chains, through the property of Mrs. Catherine Sinclair, to its junction with the present road, commencing at the dividing line between sections Nos. 11 and 12.

The quantity of land required to be taken for the proposed new line of road is eight acres one rood and four perches, and the estimated cost of effecting the said work is two thousand two hundred and eighty pounds (£2280).
