#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency CHARLES JOSEPH LA TROBE, Esquire, Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "An Act to amend an Act, intituled, "An Act for regulating the Police in the "Towns of Parramatta, Windsor, Maitland, "An Act for regulating the Reign of Parramatta, Windsor, Maitland, "Towns of Parramatta, Windsor, Maitland, "Towns of Parramatta, "Windsor, Maitland, "Towns of Parramatta, "Windsor, Maitland, "Towns of Parramatta, "Windsor, Maitland, "Towns of Parramatta, "Towns of " Bathurst, and other Towns respectively, and "' for removing and preventing Nuisances and "Obstructions, and for the better Alignment "of Streets therein," it is amongst other things enacted, That the said Act shall extend to and be in force in such Cities, Towns, and Places as the Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall by Proclamation in the Government Gazette declare to come under the operation of the same; And that it shall be lawful for the said Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits, and to revoke any such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant Governor aforesaid, with the advice of the said Executive Council, do hereby declare and appoint that the said Act shall extend to and be in force

within the following District, that is to say,
The country surrounding the Corporate boundaries of the City of Melbourne, and extending a
distance of five miles from those boundaries, and all
Towns and Places within the limits so described.
And I do define such limits to be as follow, viz.:

Commencing at a point on the coast of Port Phillip Bay, which is the south eastern corner of T. Wilsmore's portion A in section No. 3, parish of Cut-paw-paw. Bounded on the west by the section line bearing north as far as the northeastern corner of Peter Inglis's section of 640 acres (No. 16), thence by a road, also bearing north, to the north-west corner of Joseph Raleigh's No. 18.—MARCH 3RD, 1854.—1.

portion 4 in section 21. On the north, by a road running east from last mentioned point to the Saltwater River; thence by a continuation of said road, to the south-west corner of William Fletcher's portion 9, in section No. 5, in the parish of Doutta Galla; thence by the section line bearing east, crossing the Moonee Ponds, the main road to Sydney and the Merri Creek (which section line forms the southern boundary of portions 91, 90, 89, in the Parish of Jika Jika) as far as the south-east corner of George Urquhart's portion 89, aforesaid. On the east by the section line running south from said point in portion 89, to the south-western corner of Archibald Walker's portion 113, where it strikes the river Yarra Yarra. Again, on the north, by the said river Yarra Yarra to the north western corner of J. W. Cowell's portion 59, in the parish of Boroondara; thence on the east by the western boundary of the said portion 59 till it strikes the road bearing south to the Yarra Yarra River; by the corner of said river to the north eastern corner of W. H. Yaldwyn's portion (No. 18) in the parish of Prahran; thence again on the east, by a road bearing south from last mentioned point to the south-eastern corner of Archibald McMillan's portion 32, east of Elsternwick: On the south by a road bearing west from the said corner in portion 32 till it strikes the coast; thence by the line of sea coast to commencing point.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the said Colony, at Melbourne, this first day of March, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fiftyfour, and in the seventeenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

# PORTLAND BAY DISTRICT.

Description of the Reserve at Mount Leura, parish of Colongulac, containing about twenty-five square miles more or less, excluding three square miles, granted under pre-emptive right, and the areas of Lakes Bullenmerri and Gnotuk.

Commencing at a point on the west shore of Lake Colongulae or Timboon, bearing south 25 degrees west 15 chains from the north-east corner of Mr. J. G. SALARIES AND ALLOWANCES TO TEACHERS OF NATIONAL SCHOOLS.

THE Commissioners of National Education hereby give Notice, that the following will be the scale of Salaries to be paid to the Teachers of National Schools, from the 1st of January, 1854:—

These salaries are to be considered, in the case of the Head Teachers, as exclusive of school fees which will be handed over to them under such Regulations as may be laid down by the local patrons of the school.

In cases where a married couple who may be, in the opinion of the Commissioners, both competent for the office of teacher, have charge of a Mixed School, the Commissioners will ordinarily grant a full salary to each as Master and Mistress, provided the average daily attendance is sufficient and the school is conducted to the satisfaction of the Commissioners, but in schools where the attendance is small and the appointment of a Female Teacher is deemed unnecessary, the Female will receive a salary as Workmistress only, if competent for that office.

- 2. House Rent Allowance.—In cases where no residence of any kind is provided for the Teachers, the Commissioners will grant an allowance at the rate of 50 per cent. upon the fixed salary.
- 3. Paid Monitors.—The Commissioners will grant salaries averaging from £15 to £30 per annum to paid Monitors in the Schools in which they may deem their appointment advisable. The candidates should not be under 13 nor over 16 years of age; and the selection is to be made, as far as possible, from those who have shown aptitude for teaching. No house rent allowance will be made to paid Monitors.
- 4. Where the number of scholars in any particular School considerably exceeds fifty, and the nature and extent of the instruction afforded by the School are shown to be of a superior description, the Commissioners will take the same into special consideration; whilst in cases where the Teachers have conducted themselves improperly, or where the attendance has considerably decreased, their salaries may be depressed.

5.. It is to be understood that the above rates of salary will be only awarded until the Commissioners are unable to carry into effect their arrangements with reference to the classification of Teachers, when salaries will be awarded according to the Class certificates which Teachers may hold.
