4. The delivery of assayed gold will be made either at the Assay Office or at one of the Banks, with which arrangements for that purpose may have been made by the depositor.

5. The detention at the Assay Office will in general be about three days, and will rarely exceed a week.

6. All parcels received at the Assay Office will be melted down and cast into bars and stamped with the Government Stamp, specifying the weight and fineness. The Delivery Notes will also specify the equivalent in British standard for facility of calculating the value.

7. The fineness will be expressed according to the decimal system now adopted at the Bank of England. For the guidance of those to whom the new system is not familiar, the fineness will, also, for the present, be marked in carats.
