It is to be understood that these sums will only be paid to such Teachers as may be actually employed, and whose schools have been efficiently conducted in accordance with the Rules of the Board.

It will also be necessary in the case of Adult Assistants that they shall receive from the School Funds a sum equal to one-half of the amount paid by the Board, provided that the sum derived from School Funds or other local sources for this purpose shall in no case be less than Forty Pounds (£40) for Male and Twenty-five (£25) per annum for Female Assistants.

Pupil Teachers will be paid at rates ranging from Fifteen to Thirty Pounds (£15 to £30) per annum according to their qualifications, and subject to the condition that they shall enter into an engagement for not less than six months, and be actually employed for that time. As no local contribution will be required, the Teachers under whose superintendence Pupil Teachers are placed will be expected to assist them in carrying on their studies.

Allowances for house rent are given by the Board in cases where no residence of any kind is provided for the Teacher, and on condition that a sum equal to half the amount of such allowance shall be raised by local contribution for this purpose.

6. All parcels received at the Assay Office will be melted down and cast into bars and stamped with the Government Stamp, specifying the weight and fineness. The Delivery Notes will also specify the equivalent in British standard for facility of calculating the value.
7. The fineness will be expressed according to the decimal system now adopted at the Bank of England. For the guidance of those to whom the new system is not familiar, the fineness will also, for the present, be marked in carats.
