**TOWNS POLICE ACTS EXTENDED TO WARRNAMBOOL.**

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency CHARLES JOSEPH LA TROBE,  
Esquire, Lieutenant Governor of the Colony  
of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the second year of the Reign of Her Majesty, intituled, "An Act for regulating the Police in the Towns of Parramatta, Windsor, Maitland, Bathurst, and other Towns respectively, and for removing and preventing nuisances and obstructions, and for the better alignment of streets therein," and by another Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the same Reign to amend the above mentioned Act, the Lieutenant Governor is authorized, with the advice of the Executive Council, to extend the operation of the said Acts to cities, towns, and places, by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, and to define the limits of such places: Now therefore I, CHARLES JOSEPH LA TROBE, the Lieutenant Governor aforesaid, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare and appoint that the said Acts shall extend to and be in force in the Township of Warrnambool, in the said Colony of Victoria, and that the boundaries of the said Township shall be as follow, that is to say: Commencing on the River Hopkins at the south-west corner of allotment one of section one, in the parish of Wangoom, and bounded on the east by a line bearing north eighty chains; on the north by a line bearing west to the Merri River; thence by that river to its mouth; thence by the shores of Warrnambool Bay to the mouth of the Hopkins River; and by that river upwards to the commencing point; viz., the south-west corner of allotment one of section one, parish of Wangoom.
