PARIS INDUSTRIAL EXHIBITION OF 1855.

Downing-street, 9th May, 1853. Sir,—At the request of the French Ambassa dor at this Court, I have to acquaint you that a Universal Exhibition for Agricultural and In-No. 4.—JANUARY 13TH, 1854.—1. dustrial Products will be held at Paris in May, 1855; and that every facility will be afforded at the French Custom Houses to the admission of goods belonging to parties residing in the British Colonies, who may be desirous of forwarding articles for exhibition.

I shall have the honor of communicating to you further particulars on this subject so soon as the necessary arrangements shall have been completed by the French Government.

Sir,—With reference to my Circular Despatch of the 9th May, I have further to communicate to you the liberal intentions of the Government of His Imperial Majesty the Emperor of the French, respecting the admission of foreign prohibited goods to the Great Industrial Exhibition at Paris in May, 1855.

His Majesty's Government have decided that all foreign prohibited goods may be admitted for exhibition, and may be afterwards either reexported free of all duties, or may be sold in France upon the payment of an ad valorem duty at the rate of thirty per cent.
