WHEREAS by an Act of the Colonial Legislature of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for making and improving Roads in "the Colony of Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Licutenant Governor from time to time, by notice in the Government Gazette, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said Colony as to him should seem meet as and to be a Road District for the purposes in the new reciting Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every Road District thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such Road District: Now therefore I, the Officer administering the Government as aforesaid, in pursuance of the power so vested in me by the said in part recited Act, and of every other power and authority enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare the undermentioned portion of the said Colony to be a Road District, and that the boundaries of such Road District are :- On the west, the Richmond Punt Road; on the north, the River Yarra; on the south, the main Dandenong Road; on the east, the road running from the main Dandenong Road, east of Mrs. Chomley's, to the River Yarra. TOLLS LEVIABLE ON MAIN ROADS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Officer administering the Government of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Colo-nial Legislature of Victoria in the sixteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for making and improving Roads in "the Colony of Victoria," it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of His Executive Council, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to declare the Rates of Tolls to be collected by any District Road Board; and it was further enacted that in case any District Road Board should deem it advisable that money should be raised by tolls, it should be lawful for such Board, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, to cause from time to time such and so many toll-bars, toll-gates, and toll-houses to be erected and built in and upon the roads within their respective Road Districts, at such places as to each Board should seem fit; and in like manner to cause such toll-bars, toll-gates, and toll-houses to be removed or built or placed on other parts of the said roads, and to direct tolls to be paid for all animals and vehicles passing or re-passing through such toll-bars, toll-gates, or toll-houses at a rate not exceeding the rates to be declared as aforesaid, and such rates from time to time to reduce or raise to any amount not exceeding the rates to be so declared; provided that no toll should be taken at any such toll-bar, toll-gate, or toll-house as aforesaid, until a list of the tolls payable thereat should have been publicly notified in the Government Gazette at least one month previously: And whereas by another Act passed by the Colonial Legislature of Victoria in the seventeenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, to amend the above recited Act, it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, pursuant to the provisions of the nineteenth section of the said above recited Act, to declare, alter, and revoke the Rates of Tolls to be collected by the Central Road Board in manner in the now reciting Act directed in like manner as by the said nineteenth section is directed as to a District Road Board, and that it should be lawful for the said Central Road Board, or any person authorzed by them, to collect and receive such tolls: And it was further enacted that the several provisions in the twentieth section of the aforesaid Act, as to a District Road Board levying toll, should be deemed to authorize the said Central Road Board to levy tolls and erect toll-bars, tollgates, and toll-houses, and to do and cause to be done all other acts which any District Road Board is by the aforesaid Act authorised to do in their respective Districts, and all such provisions of the said Act should apply and extend to the said Central Road Board, and to such tolls so levied by the said Board; And whereas it has been deemed expedient to establish toll-gates upon several of the Main Roads throughout the said Colony: Now therefore I, the Officer administering the Government aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the two hereinbefore recited Acts of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's Reign, and of all and every other No. 42.—May 23RD, 1854.—2.
