By His Excellency the Officer administering the Government of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Colonial Legislature of Victoria in the sixteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*," it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of His Executive Council, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to declare the Rates of Tolls to be collected by any District Road Board; and it was further enacted that in case any District Road Board should deem it advisable that money should be raised by tolls, it should be lawful for such Board, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, to cause from time to time such and so many toll-bars, toll-gates, and toll-houses to be erected and built in and upon the roads within their respective Road Districts, at such places as to each Board should seem fit; and in like manner to cause such toll-bars, toll-gates, and toll-houses to be removed or built or placed on other parts of the said roads, and to direct tolls to be paid for all animals and vehicles passing or re-passing through such toll-bars, toll-gates, or toll-houses at a rate not exceeding the rates to be declared as aforesaid, and such rates from time to time to reduce or raise to any amount not exceeding the rates to be so declared; provided that no toll should be taken at any such toll-bar, toll-gate, or toll-house as aforesaid, until a list of the tolls payable thereat should have been

*Despatch from the Secretary of State to the
Lieutenant Governor, 17th January, 1854.*

I transmit to you the copy of a letter from one
of the Under Secretaries of State for Foreign
Affairs with the copy of one from the Acting
British Vice Consul at Mogador, containing a
description of the Argan Tree, which grows
generally throughout the States of Western
Barbary, and which, from its general character,
and the nutritious properties of its fruit as food
for cattle, may, it is thought, be successfully and
profitably introduced into Australia.

A small portion of the fruit or seeds alluded
to in the Foreign Office letter is herewith for-
warded; but if it should hereafter be thought
desirable to try the experiment of planting the
tree on a more extensive scale in the Colony of
Victoria, I shall have much pleasure in affording
you every assistance towards obtaining a larger
supply.

I am directed by the Earl of Clarendon to transmit to you, to be laid before His Grace the Duke of Newcastle, the accompanying copy of a letter from Mr. Grace, the Acting British Vice Consul at Mogador, giving a description of the Argan Tree, which grows more or less throughout the States of Western Barbary.

From the description of this tree it would appear to Lord Clarendon to be one which, if successfully introduced into our Australian Colonies, might, in time, to a certain extent, remedy one of the great wants of these Colonies, namely, a supply of food for cattle in seasons of drought. A bag containing the fruit or seeds of the Argan Tree accompanies this letter, and if the Duke of Newcastle should concur with Lord Clarendon in thinking that the tree would be an acquisition to the Australian Colonies, I am to suggest that you will move His Grace to forward the seeds to Australia, with a view to their distribution among the authorities in that Colony, or in such other manner as will be most likely to accomplish the introduction of the Argan Tree into Australia.

Mogador, 7th November, 1853.

SIR,

The Argan Tree grows more or less throughout the states of Western Barbary, but principally in the Province of Haha, and south of this town.

The soil in which it is found is light, sandy, and very stony: it is usually found upon the hills which are barren of all else, and where irrigation is impossible.

I should imagine, from the appearance of some of the trees, that they are from one to two hundred years old; and a remarkably large one in this neighbourhood I should say is at least three hundred. The tree measures round the trunk 26 feet; at the height of 3 feet it branches off (one of them measures 11 feet near the trunk), these branches rest upon the ground at about 15 feet from the trunk, and again ascend; the highest branch of this tree is not more than 16 to 18 feet; the outer branches extend to a circumference of 220 feet: this is the largest I am aware of.

The system of propagation in this vicinity is mostly by seed. When sowing this, a little manure is placed with it, and it is well watered until it shoots, from which period it requires nothing further. It bears fruit at from three to five years, which ripens from May to August (according to situation of tree); the roots extend a great distance underground, and shoots make their appearance at intervals, which are allowed to remain, thus doing away with the necessity of transplanting or sowing. As the fruit ripens, herds of goats, sheep, and cows, are taken out; a man beats the tree with a long pole, and the nuts fall and are devoured voraciously by the cattle: in the evening they are driven home, and when comfortably settled in their yard, they commence chewing the cud, and throw out the nuts, which are collected each morning as soon as the cattle have departed upon their daily excursion. I have heard it remarked that the nut passes through the stomach of the animal, but this is only a casualty, and not a general rule. Large quantities are collected by women and children, which

are well dried; the hull is taken off and stored for camels and mules travelling in the winter: they are considered very nutritious.

The process of extracting the oil is very simple. The nuts are cracked by the women and children (and not a few fingers at the same time, owing to the want of proper tools, for the nuts are very hard, and a stone is the only implement used), the kernels are then parched in a common earthen vessel, ground in handmills of this country, then put in a pan, a little cold water sprinkled upon it, when it is well worked by the hand (much the same as kneading dough), until the oil separates itself, when the refuse is well pressed in the hand, which completes the process. The oil is let stand, and the sediment removed. The cake (in which a great deal of oil remains, owing to the want of a proper press) is generally given to the milch cows or goats.

I never heard of any part being used as manure, but I have no doubt it would form an excellent one.

Some of these Argans are in clusters, others in single trees.
