9. Lands of the Third class, namely, Country Lots, including such as are designated "Special Country Lots," which may have been exposed to public competition, at auction, subsequent to the date hereof, but not sold, may be had at their upset price by the person or persons who may first apply and pay for them at the Colonial Treasury; but such applications will not be entertained until one month from the day allowed for paying the balances of each sale has expired. CHAPTER X.—Continued.

FINES.

Judges' Associate to make out Schedules of Fines, &c. 27.
