ADDITIONAL POLLING PLACES FOR THE LODDON DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Officer administering the Government of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Colonial Legislature of New South Wales, passed in the fourteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, called, "*The Victoria Electoral Act of 1851*," it was amongst other things enacted, that the places for taking the poll at elections in the several Electoral Districts should be those specified in the Schedule annexed to the now reciting Act, and it was provided that such other places should be polling places for the said Electoral Districts as should be appointed for that purpose by the Governor, by any Proclamation to be issued by him in that behalf, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the Colony: Now therefore I, the Officer administering the Government as aforesaid, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the said in part recited Act, do hereby proclaim and appoint that the undermentioned places shall be polling places for the Electoral District specified in connexion therewith, in addition to the polling places appointed by the said Act, viz. :—

LODDON DISTRICT—Melbourne, Castle Donnington, Mr. Ross's Station, Campaspe Creek, and Bayes's Inn, Lower Loddon.

HEATHCOTE.—SPECIAL LICENSING DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Officer administering the Government of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Colonial Legislature of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to make provision for the sale of fermented and Spirituous Liquors and of Refreshments in certain Districts," it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time to proclaim any part or portion of the said Colony to be a District, subject to the provisions of the now reciting Act, to be called "A Special Licensing District," and to define the boundaries of such District, and from time to time to vary alter and revoke such boundaries and any such Notice and Proclamation; And whereas by a Proclamation dated the sixteenth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, certain parts or portions of the said Colony were proclaimed to be "Special Licensing Districts," and it is uncertain whether the said Proclamation extends to the portion of the said Colony hereinafter described: Now therefore I, the Officer administering the Government as aforesaid, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation of the sixteenth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, as relates to the portion of the said Colony hereinafter described; And I do hereby proclaim the following part or portion of the said Colony to be a "Special Licensing District," under the provisions of the said recited Act; And do define the boundaries thereof to be the same as the boundaries of the "Heathcote General Sessions and County Court District," that is to say:—

Commencing at the confluence of the Rivers Campaspe and Coliban; thence by a line south-easterly to the source of the McIvor or Patterson's Creek, above John Hunter Patterson's sheep station; thence by a line north-easterly to the confluence of Hughes's Creek with the River Goulburn, and by that River to the Murray; thence by the River Murray to its confluence with the River Campaspe, and by the River Campaspe upwards to the confluence of the Rivers Campaspe and Coliban aforesaid.
