PARIS INDUSTRIAL EXHIBITION OF 1855.

dustrial Products will be held at Paris in May, 1855; and that every facility will be afforded at the French Custom Houses to the admission of goods belonging to parties residing in the British Colonics, who may be desirous of forwarding articles for exhibition.

SIR,—With reference to my Circular Despatch of the 9th May, I have further to communicate to you the liberal intentions of the Government to you the liberal intentions of the Government of His Imperial Majesty the Emperor of the French, respecting the admission of foreign prohibited goods to the Great Industrial Exhibition at Paris in May, 1855.

His Majesty's Government have decided that all foreign prohibited goods may be admitted for exhibition, and may be afterwards either reexported free of all duties, or may be sold in

France upon the payment of an ad valorem duty at the rate of thirty per cent.
