ADDITIONAL POLLING PLACES FOR THE
LODDON DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Officer administering the
Government of the Colony of Victoria and its
Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Colonial
Legislature of New South Wales, passed
in the fourteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign,
called, "*The Victoria Electoral Act of 1851*,"
it was amongst other things enacted, that the
places for taking the poll at elections in the
several Electoral Districts should be those speci-
fied in the Schedule annexed to the now reciting
Act, and it was provided that such other places
should be polling places for the said Electoral
Districts as should be appointed for that purpose
by the Governor, by any Proclamation to be
issued by him in that behalf, and published in
the *Government Gazette* of the Colony: Now
therefore I, the Officer administering the Govern-
ment as aforesaid, by virtue of the power and
authority vested in me by the said in part recited
Act, do hereby proclaim and appoint that the
undermentioned places shall be polling places for
the Electoral District specified in connexion there-
with, in addition to the polling places appointed
by the said Act, viz. :—

LODDON DISTRICT—Melbourne, Castle Donning-
ton, Mr. Ross's Station, Campaspe Creek,
and Bayes's Inn, Lower Loddon.

thousand eight hundred and fifty-four,
and in the seventeenth year of Her
Majesty's Reign.

TRANSMISSION OF GOLD TO ADELAIDE.

HIS Excellency the Officer administering the Government has approved of the following Regulations for the future transmission of Gold from the Colony of Victoria to Adelaide, in lieu of those issued in December, 1853, at the instance of the Government of South Australia.

1. Gold dust intended for transmission to Adelaide, from the Gold Fields of Victoria, may be deposited with the Assistant Gold Commissioners at the several Gold Fields; and the Escort Fee, charged by the Victorian Government, paid at the same time, together with any gold duty leviable by law, in Victoria.

2. The gold thus deposited should be addressed to the Manager of the Bank of South Australia; and receipts will be given to the depositor by the Commissioners at the Gold Fields, on production of which, at the Bank of South Australia, in Adelaide, the gold will be delivered to the holder, on payment of a charge at the rate of sixpence an ounce.

3. The gold will be sent, by the Commissioners of Gold Fields, to Melbourne, and there shipped by the Bank of Victoria, in Melbourne, on behalf of the Bank of South Australia, under proper arrangements to secure its safe transport to and delivery in Adelaide.
