PARIS INDUSTRIAL EXHIBITION OF 1855.

Downing-street, 9th May, 1853.

SIR,—At the request of the French Ambassador at this Court, I have to acquaint you that a Universal Exhibition for Agricultural and In-

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dustrial Products will be held at Paris in May, 1855; and that every facility will be afforded at the French Custom Houses to the admission of goods belonging to parties residing in the British Colonies, who may be desirous of forwarding articles for exhibition.

I shall have the honor of communicating to you further particulars on this subject so soon as the necessary arrangements shall have been completed by the French Government.

SIR,—With reference to my Circular Despatch of the 9th May, I have further to communicate to you the liberal intentions of the Government of His Imperial Majesty the Emperor of the French, respecting the admission of foreign prohibited goods to the Great Industrial Exhibition at Paris in May, 1855.

His Majesty's Government have decided that all foreign prohibited goods may be admitted for exhibition, and may be afterwards either re-exported free of all duties, or may be sold in France upon the payment of an *ad valorem* duty at the rate of thirty per cent.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency CHARLES JOSEPH LA TROBE, Esquire, Lieutenant Governor in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, made and passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria," it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor from time to time to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said Colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a Road District for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every Road District, thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such Road District, and from time to time to revoke any such Proclamation, and vary and alter the boundary of any such District as may be necessary and advisable: Now therefore I, CHARLES JOSEPH LA TROBE, Esquire, Lieutenant Governor as aforesaid, in pursuance of the power so vested in me by the said in part recited Act, and of every other power and authority enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare the undermentioned portion of the said Colony to be a Road District, and that the boundaries of such Road District are: Commencing at the junction of the Back Creek with the Kooyong Root Creek, and bounded on the south by the Kooyong Root Creek to its confluence with the Yarra Yarra River; by that River westerly to the south-west corner of the Survey Paddock; thence by a line north to the road dividing Suburban Allotments 15 and 16 in the parish of Jika Jika; by this road west to the public road between Allotments 20 and 21 in the same parish; by the said road north to the Yarra Yarra River; by that River northerly and easterly till intersected by a line north from the junction of the Back and Kooyong Root Creeks; and by a line south to the commencing point: And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that such Road District shall be called and known as the "Hawthorne Road District," in the County of Bourke, in the said Colony of Victoria.

as acting Solicitor General, to be a Member of the said Legislative Council, in lieu of the said James Croke, Esquire, and until Her Majesty's pleasure shall be known.
