AVIS AU PUBLIC.

Son Excellence le Lieutenant Gouverneur ayant nommé des Commissaires pour choisir, préparer, ordonner, et transmettre les objets destinés à représenter les ressources industrielles de la Colonie de Victoria, à l'Exposition Universelle des Produits de l'Agriculture et de l'Industrie de Paris, dans le mois de Mai, 1855, et le Conseil Législatif ayant voté la somme de 3,000 livres sterlings pour défrayer les dépenses nécessaires, les Commissaires prient instamment les habitants de la Colonie de les aider cordialement dans le but qu'ils se proposent, car sans leur co-opération empressée et bienveillante tous les efforts et toute l'énergie des Commissaires seront insuffisants pour faire représenter dignement les produits de l'industrie de la Colonie de Victoria à l'Exposition prochaine.

L'importance d'exposer à Paris des échantillons de l'industrie, ainsi que des produits naturels de ce pays, est apparente, non seulement comme science et comme curiosité, mais encore comme utilité pratique, qui, en développant dans ce pays ses propres ressources, ne peut manquer d'exercer une influence étendue et salutaire dans ses arts, son commerce, et ses progrès matériels et sociaux.

L'exposition d'objets rares et curieux en Histoire Naturelle non seulement intéresse et instruit, mais en excitant l'esprit de recherche conduit à de nouvelles découvertes, dont les résultats ajouteront quelque chose de plus à l'avancement des applications utiles et aux agrémens de la vie.

The number of persons allowed to be in each boat shall depend on the dimensions thereof. Boats of five feet beam may earry (including crew) one person to every two feet length, one person additional will be allowed for every additional six inches of beam, and one less for every six inches under five feet of beam.

Each boat may carry 8lbs. weight of luggage or cargo for each person, or 1 cwt. in lieu of each person short of the complement allowed.

From any of the points named in the schedule of fares one-half of the fare is to be charged back, the detention not exceeding one quarter of an hour, beyond which full fare.

Every licensed boatman in the Port of Melbourne is to wear a badge, having inscribed thereon his name and the number of his license, which badge he must wear firmly sewed to the left breast of his coat, jacket, or other external body dress, so that the same may be distinctly visible at all times during the hours he may lawfully be required to ply his boat.

When a chequered flag is hoisted at the mast head of the flagstaff at Williamstown all fares are to be charged one-half more than those specified, and in foul weather, when a blue flag is hoisted, fares are to be doubled.

Every licensed boatman at all times to have a printed copy of the fares and regulations, and to produce the same at the request of any person who may have hired any such licensed boat.
