DAY OF SOLEMN FAST, HUMILIATION, AND PRAYER.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HOTHAM, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Military Order of the Bath, Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS a Public Day of Solemn Fast, Humiliation, and Prayer, hath been observed throughout the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, for the purpose of imploring Almighty God to bless and assist Her Majesty's arms in the just and necessary war in which Her Majesty is engaged: His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby invites the Clergy and Ministers of Religion, and all others Her Majesty's subjects in the Colony of Victoria, to observe, in like manner, a Public Day of Solemn Fast, Humiliation, and Prayer, on FRIDAY, the Fourth Day of August next, that so we, Her Majesty's subjects in this remote part of the Empire, may also humble ourselves as one man, before Almighty God (who decides the issues of war as He dispenses peace and mercy), in order to obtain pardon for our sins, and that we, in the most devout and solemn manner, may offer up our prayers and supplications to the Divine Majesty, imploring His blessing and assistance on the British arms for the restoration of peace.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-first day of July, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, and in the eighteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Colonial Legislature of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, No. 40. intituled, "*An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*," it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor from time by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said Colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a Road District for the purposes in the now reciting Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every Road District thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such Road District: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant Governor as aforesaid, in pursuance of the power so vested in me by the said in part recited Act, and of every other power and authority enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare the undermentioned portion of the said Colony to be a Road District, and that the boundaries of such Road District are: On the North—the northern boundary line of the parish of Wollert; on the West—the sectional line commencing at the north-west corner of section 8, in the township of Epping, and running thence to the south-west corner of section 22, in the parish of Keelbundora, thence due west along the southern boundary line of the said section to its junction with the Merri Creek, thence southerly along the Merri Creek to the south-west corner of section 12 in the parish of Keelbundora, thence due east to the north-west corner of section 147, in the parish of Jika Jika, thence due south to the south-west corner of section 144 in the same parish; on the South—the road running along the south side of section 144 in the parish of Jika Jika, to its junction with the main road from Melbourne to Epping, thence along the eastern boundary line of section 139 in the parish of Jika Jika to its south-east corner at the junction of the Epping and Upper Plenty Roads; and on the East—a straight line commencing at the junction of the Epping and Upper Plenty Roads bearing north 18 degrees east for a distance of about three miles and eight chains to the south-east corner of section 14 in the parish of Keelbundora and the Darebin Creek, and thence along the Darebin Creek to the north boundary of the parish of Wollert: And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that such Road District shall be called and known as "*The Epping Road District*," in the county of Bourke, in the said Colony of Victoria.

#### NEUTRAL VESSELS.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, at the instance of the Vice-Consul for Denmark and for Sweden and Norway, has authorized the publication of the following documents, conveying instructions to the subjects of those countries respectively for the due observance of neutrality during the present hostilities with Russia.

*Extract from Despatches received from the Danish Government, at the Danish Consulate, Melbourne, dated 9th March, 1854.*

THE system which His Majesty intends invariably to follow and to apply, is that of a strict neutrality, founded upon loyalty, impartiality, and equal regard to the rights of all powers. The Government of His Majesty the King of Denmark following up the above referred to system of neutrality, therefore lays down the following principles:—

1. To abstain directly or indirectly from all participation in the war that may ensue, in favor of one of the contending parties to the detriment of the other.

2. To admit into the ports of the monarchy men-of-war, and trading vessels belonging to the belligerent parties, the government, however, reserving the right of interdicting to the first mentioned of these, as also to vessels of transport belonging to the respective fleets of the contending powers, the entrance into the port of Christianso.

Any regulations concerning public health and police, which might be called forth by the circumstances, must of course be observed and respected. Corsairs (privateers) shall not be admitted into the ports, nor tolerated in the roads of His Danish Majesty's dominions.

3. To allow to vessels of the belligerent parties the right of providing themselves in the ports of the Monarchy with all provisions and merchandize they may be in want of, with the exception of such articles as are known to be contraband of war.

4. To exclude every prize vessel from entrance (case of distress always excepted), condemnation, and sale in any port of the monarchy, and finally,

5. That by the commercial relations of the Danish State with the countries at war, Danish ships and cargoes shall enjoy every security and facility, under obligation, however, to abide by the regulations generally established and acknowledged in the special cases of blockades declared and effected.

*Royal Orders, shewing what must be observed for the safety of the Trade and Navigation of Sweden, during war between foreign Powers. Given at the Castle of Stockholm, 8th of April, 1854.*

WE, Oscar, by the grace of God, King of Sweden, Norway, Gotha, and Vandalen, do hereby make known:—

That, having seen the necessity, in the now approaching hostilities between foreign maritime powers, that those of our subjects who carry on trade and navigation, may to the utmost observe those obligations and precautions which are necessary to ensure to the Swedish Flag the rights and privileges due to it as a neutral flag, and to avoid all that in any way may render it suspicious to the belligerent powers, and expose it to insults, we have deemed proper that, setting aside all that has been formerly prescribed in these matters, the following rules should henceforward be observed:—

1. To be enabled to enjoy the rights and privileges due to the Swedish flag as neutral, a Swedish vessel should be provided with such documents as, according to existing Statutes, are necessary to establish its nation, which documents ought always to be had ready during the voyage of the vessel.

2. It is strictly prohibited to commanders of vessels to possess false or double ship documents and bills of lading, as also to hoist a foreign flag, be it on any occasion, or on any pretext whatever.

3. If, while a Swedish vessel is in a foreign port, the crew should be so diminished by death, sickness, desertion, or any other cause, that the same is found insufficient to work the vessel, and foreign seamen must be employed in lieu thereof, subjects belonging to neutral states ought to be given the preference; and under no circumstances whatever must the number of subjects belonging to the belligerent powers, on board the vessel, amount to more than a third part of the crew. Each such change in the manning of the vessel, as also the cause thereof, must be put down on the roll by the commander, and the veracity of this annotation be certified by a competent Swedish Consul or Vice-Consul; or if such do not exist in the place, by a Magistrate, Public Notary, or any other authority as the customs of the respective countries may be.

4. Swedish vessels may, as neutrals freely visit the ports and coasts of the belligerent powers; but a commander must not try to enter a blockaded port after having been formally informed of the blockade.

With a blockaded port is meant such a one as is closed by one or several men-of-war, in a way that entrance cannot be effected without apparent danger.

5. All sorts of merchandize, even such as belongs to subjects of any of the belligerent powers, may be carried freely in Swedish vessels, as neutral, except what is called contraband of war, by which is meant, cannons, howitzers, all kinds of arms, bombs, shells, balls, flints, matches, gunpowder, saltpetre, sulphur, mailcoats, lances, belts, cartouches, saddles and bridles, and other *fabricates* (articles) that may be employed for war—always excepting that quantity of the above-mentioned articles that are needful for the defence of the vessel and crew.

If, as regards the definition of contraband of war, any change or addition should be made in consequence of convention between Us and foreign powers, such will be particularly made known.

6. It is prohibited to every Swedish commander to suffer himself and the vessel he commands to be made use of in transporting despatches, troops, or articles classing under contraband of war, by any of the belligerent powers, without being compelled to do so, in which case he must make a formal protest against such violations.

7. Vessels belonging to the belligerent powers may import and export into and from Swedish Ports all merchandize and effects whatsoever, provided such imports and exports are allowed in the Custom House Tariff, always excepting such articles as go under the head of contraband of war.

8. It is strictly prohibited to every Swedish subject to arm or equip any vessel intended for privateering against any of the belligerent powers, or their subjects and property, or to participate in the equipment of any such vessel. It is also prohibited to serve in any foreign privateer.

9. It is not permitted to foreign privateers to enter a Swedish port, or lie to in our inlets, nor can prizes be taken into Swedish ports, except in case of distress, and even in such a case must not be condemned and sold within the kingdom. Our subjects are particularly forbidden to buy from privateers any prizes, whatever be their denomination.

10. Swedish commanders sailing without an armed escort, and being spoken by any armed vessel belonging to a belligerent power, who has a right to examine the ship's documents, must not refuse to produce them, nor try to escape, but he must loyally, (faithfully), and honestly, produce his documents, and furthermore see, that neither before the examination nor while it is going on, any document that concerns the vessel or cargo is destroyed, abstracted, or thrown overboard.

11. When a Swedish commander sails under escort or armed vessels, he must observe the rules laid down in the Royal Regulations of the 10th June, 1812.

12. If a Swedish commander properly observes all that is laid down in the above paragraphs for his information, he ought, according to conventions and common national rights, to enjoy a free and unmo- lested passage: and if, nevertheless, he should be insulted, he may be assured he will be most energetically supported by our Ministers and Consuls in foreign places, in all just demands on his part of satisfaction and damages; whereas the commander who omits or neglects what is prescribed for his observation during the voyage, will have himself to blame for the consequences that may attend such neglect, and cannot have a right to our protection.

13. Should a Swedish vessel be seized, the commander of the vessel must immediately remit to the Consul or Vice-Consul of the port to which the vessel has been brought, or if no Consul should exist in that place, then to the nearest Consul or Vice-Consul, a full and duly certified report stating all the particulars of the said seizure.

All that it may concern are requested to observe the above regulations, to the further confirmation of which we have signed this with our own hand, and caused our Royal Seal to be impressed thereon.

**1. North Ronaldshay Lighthouse.**

The Commissioners of the Northern Lighthouses hereby give notice that a Lighthouse is being built upon the Island of North Ronaldshay, in Orkney, the Light of which will be exhibited on the night of Friday, the 1st September, 1854, and every night thereafter, from the going away of daylight in the evening, to the return of daylight in the morning.

*The following is a description of the Lighthouse, and the appearance of the Light, by MR. DAVID STEVENSON, Engineer to the Commissioners:—*

The Lighthouse is in N. Lat. 59° 23' 15", and W. Long. 2° 23' 38"; it stands on the Northern Point of the Island of North Ronaldshay, and by compass it bears from Moul-head of Papa-Westra W.N.W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  North, distance 15 nautic miles; and from Start-Point of Sanday Lighthouse, S.S.W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  West, distance 6  $\frac{1}{2}$  miles.

The North Ronaldshay Light will be known to Mariners as a Revolving Light, producing a bright flash of the natural colour once in every 10 seconds. It will be visible all round the Compass. The Lantern is elevated 140 feet above the level of the sea; and the Light will be seen at the distance of about 18 nautic miles, and at lesser distances, according to the state of the atmosphere.

**2. Start-Point Lighthouse.**

The Start-Point Light, which is 6  $\frac{1}{2}$  miles from North Ronaldshay Light, being at present a Revolving Light, producing a bright flash once in every minute, the Commissioners further give notice, that on and after the night of Friday, the 1st September, 1854, when the new Revolving Light at North Ronaldshay is to be exhibited, the present Revolving Light at Start-Point will be changed to a Fixed Light of the natural colour.

## CITY COUNCIL OF MELBOURNE.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, 14 Victoria, No. 20, intituled, "*An Act for regulating the formation, drainage, and repair of streets, courts, and alleys on private property within the City of Melbourne*," it is amongst other things enacted, that where any street, court, or alley, on private property, in the City of Melbourne, shall not be, or shall not have been sufficiently paved, flagged, macadamized, levelled, drained, and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired to the satisfaction of the Council of the said City, it shall be lawful for the said Council at any time, and from time to time, by any order under the hand of the Mayor or Town Clerk of the said City, for the time being respectively, to order that any such street, court, or alley, or any part thereof, shall be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamized, levelled, drained, and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired, in such manner and within such time as to the said Council may appear expedient, and thereupon the owners of the tenements adjoining, or abutting upon such street, court, or alley on each side thereof, shall in such manner, and within such time as shall be expressed in such order, at their respective costs, charges, and expenses, remove all obstructions, and well and sufficiently pave, flag, and macadamize, level, drain, and sewer, or otherwise complete or repair so much of the said street, court, or alley to the centre thereof as may be opposite to and co-extensive with their respective tenements, adjoining or abutting on such streets, courts, or alleys respectively: And whereas the streets, courts, and alleys enumerated in the schedule to this order annexed, marked A, have not been sufficiently paved, flagged, macadamized, levelled, drained, and sewered, or otherwise completed or repaired to the satisfaction of the Council of the City of Melbourne:

Be it now ordered by the Council of the said City, that the streets, courts, and alleys enumerated in the schedule to this order annexed, marked A, shall within forty days from the date of this order coming into operation, be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamized, levelled, drained, and sewered in such manner as is expressed in the schedule to this order annexed, marked B; and it is hereby notified to the owners respectively of the tenements adjoining or abutting upon the streets, courts, and alleys enumerated in the schedule to this order annexed, marked A, that if they, or any of them, shall neglect or omit to remove the obstructions, and pave, flag, macadamize, level, drain, and sewer, or otherwise complete or repair the street, court, or alley on which their tenements respectively adjoin or abut, in the manner and within the time expressed in this order, then the Council of the said City will remove all obstructions in the said streets, courts, and alleys, and pave, flag, macadamize, level, drain, sewer, and otherwise complete or repair the same, or such parts thereof as shall not have been so done pursuant to this order, and will thereupon ascertain, determine, and charge such respective owners with their several proportionate parts of the costs, charges, and expenses thereof, according to and co-extensive with their respective tenements adjoining or abutting on such street, court, or alley, having

regard in such apportionment to the state and condition of the pavement, flagging, macadamizing, levelling, drainage, and sewerage in which such streets, courts, or alleys respectively, or any part thereof, shall or may be at the time of making this order.

Made and passed by the Council of the City of Melbourne, this twelfth day of July, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-four.

SCHEDULE B, REFERRED TO IN THIS ORDER.  
*Manner in which the Streets, Courts, and Alleys, enumerated in Schedule A, referred to in this Order, are ordered to be freed from obstruction, paved, flagged, macadamized, levelled, drained, and sewered.*

The natural soil is to be reduced or made up as the case may require, so that the longitudinal section of the whole right-of-way shall in no part have an inclination of less than 1 in 120; and wherever practicable the entire length is to form one incline. In laying on any stuff it is to be spread in layers of not more than one foot thick. The transverse section of the right-of-way is to show a roadway whose crown shall be one inch above the kerbs of the footways, and the fall from the crown of the water channels is to be at the rate of 1 in 25.

On either side of the roadway there is to be a water channel eighteen inches wide, consisting of two rows of bluestone pitchers, nine inches deep, and not less than nine inches by fourteen inches on the surface, with upright sides, set in loam, and rammed with a rammer weighing forty pounds, so as to subside four inches.

The bottom of the channel is to be seven inches below the top of the kerbs.

On either side of the roadway there is also to be a footway not more than three feet wide, and these are to be separated from the roadway by a red gum plank or kerb, ten inches by three, set on edge, and fastened with five inch spikes to piles four inches by four of red gum, three feet long, driven into the soil.

The footways are to be covered with a coat of gravel three inches thick, and the surface is to fall towards the channel at the rate of 1 in 10. The roadway is to be covered with a coat of broken metal, broken to a two and a half inch gauge, and laid on seven inches thick at the channels and eight inches at the crown; and this, when necessary, is to be covered with a coat of loam one and a half inches thick.

Wherever private entrances lead from the rights-of-way they are to be paved to the full width with bluestone pitchers, in the same manner as the channels; paving is to be extended from the channels towards the line of houses or fences, so as to cross the entire footway.

The whole of the work must be done under the inspection and subject to the approval of the City Surveyor, who is authorized to order any deviation from these general principles which the particularities of any case may require.
