QUARANTINE.

CASES of Small-pox having occurred on board the steamship *Great Britain*, during her passage from England to this port, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under the authority of the Acts of the Governor and Council of New South Wales, 3 William IV., No. 1, and 5 Victoria, No. 12, has deemed it necessary to place the vessel, crew and passengers under quarantine, in conformity with the provisions of those Acts, for a period of fourteen days from the convalescence of the last case of infectious disease, of which all persons are hereby to take notice accordingly.

The boundaries of the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean are specified in a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of November, 1852.

ADDRESSES OF CONGRATULATION.

THE following Addresses were presented to His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor of Victoria at the Levee, held at Geelong, on the 16th day of August, 1854, to all of which His Excellency returned verbal acknowledgments.

MAYOR, ALDERMEN, COUNCILLORS, AND BURGESSES OF THE TOWN OF GEELONG.

To His Excellency SIR CHARLES HOTHAM, K.C.B., Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria, and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY—

We, the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Geelong, desire to approach your Excellency on this auspicious occasion with our sincere and earnest congratulations, and to assure you that it is with feelings of no ordinary pleasure that we welcome your Excellency and Lady Hotham, on this your first visit to the Town of Geelong, and again reiterate our sentiments of loyalty and affection to our beloved Sovereign the Queen, and our unfeigned respect to your Excellency as Her Majesty's Representative.

As the Representatives of the Body Corporate, we feel it our bounden duty, respectfully trusting that your Excellency will not deem it out of place, briefly to bring under your notice at this time some most important and necessary public works that are urgently required to be performed, the necessity for which we have no doubt will at once be apparent to your Excellency, involving as they do the healthful condition of the town and district, and indeed the general welfare of the whole community.

1. *The providing Sewerage and Supply of Water for the Town.*—Plans, surveys, and estimates for which were made by the Government some time since, with a view to the carrying out these most necessary works. The peculiar, indeed almost unequalled, advantages which the town of Geelong possesses, in its adaptability for sewerage and supply of water, would render the performance of these most important works a matter of but little difficulty, and at a comparatively trifling expense, whilst the blessings and happiness conferred upon the people in a sanitary point of view would be incalculably great.
2. *Wharf Accommodation.*—It will easily be seen how greatly accommodation of this kind is required for the shipping of the port, the present wharves, undeserving of the name, being totally inadequate for the purpose, it frequently occurs that vessels are detained for several weeks, waiting for a berth to discharge cargoes, the want of accommodation in this respect will be still more severely felt when the bar is removed, which it is hoped will be in a short time, so that large ships may come up to the town, instead of, as at present, anchoring at Point Henry.
3. *The Removal of the Bar.*—We respectfully trust that this great work will be energetically carried on; the advantages which the mercantile, trading, and indeed all classes of the community, would derive from this obstacle to the free navigation of the port being removed, are obvious.
4. *The erection of a Bridge across the Barwon.*
5. *The repairing the main approaches of the Town.*
6. *The erection of a new Court House and Public Offices,* for which £20,000 were voted by the Legislative Council last Session.
7. *The extension of the Gaol,* for which £20,000 were voted by the Legislative Council last Session.
8. *The erection of a Post Office,* for which £3000 were voted by the Legislative Council last Session.
9. *The appointment of a Resident Judge* in the town of Geelong.
10. *The establishment of an Office for the Registration of Deeds, &c.*
11. *The laying out the Reserve,* already made as a Botanical Garden, for the recreation of the inhabitants.
12. *The erection of a Flag Staff,* for which £3000 were voted by the Legislative Council last Session.

We will not trespass upon your Excellency on this occasion, by dilating upon the necessity of these works being carried out at an early period, or of the vast benefits that would be conferred upon the inhabitants of this rapidly progressing town and district, and, indeed, in a great degree to the Colony in general, as these matters will, we are convinced, be readily perceived by your Excellency.

In conclusion, we again respectfully give your Excellency and your Honorable Lady a sincere and hearty welcome to our fair and highly favored town, earnestly trusting that, under the blessing of Divine Providence, all your Excellency's endeavours to carry on the Government of this magnificent country may be crowned with the most complete success, so that the social, moral, and religious condition of the people, the advancement of their material prosperity, and the boundless resources of Victoria be fully developed.

Wishing that your Excellency and Lady Hotham may long enjoy uninterrupted health and happiness, and long live to witness the splendid and beneficial results of your Excellency's wise administration of the Government of Victoria,

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY—

We, the representatives of the Geelong Chamber of Commerce, desire to offer our hearty welcome to your Excellency and Lady Hotham, on your safe arrival in this most important Colony, and at the same time to express our steady and unswerving loyalty to our Gracious Sovereign Queen Victoria, and the high respect we entertain for your Excellency as the representative of Her Majesty.

We congratulate your Excellency on your appointment to the Government of a country of which the resources are unexampled, affording most ample scope for the employment of energy and capital; rich in mines of precious metals; blessed with a fertile soil, capable of producing every necessary, and many of the luxuries of life; and harbors so ample that mighty fleets may safely ride within them; with an extent of commerce, when considered in regard to the brief period in which it has been raised, almost unequalled in the history of the world; a land where labor is so amply remunerated that skill and industry alone are needed to secure to the working man all that is requisite for present comfort, with a prospect of ultimate independence; and one in which the struggles of industrious poverty to obtain a livelihood, so frequent in the old world, are quite unknown.

We beg to express to your Excellency the confident hope we feel that during your administration of the government, all those measures will have your support which are adapted to promote and secure the faithful dispensation of the law, the full enjoyment of our civil and religious privileges, the maintenance of the rights of property, the extension of our commerce, and the development of the great natural resources of the country at large; and as by these means your Excellency will secure the progressive and permanent advancement and prosperity of the colonists, and establish the peace and good order of society, we shall ever feel it a duty and a privilege to co-operate with and aid the efforts of your Excellency, in order that this land, our adopted home, may enjoy a proud pre-eminence among the many colonies which owe allegiance to the British Crown.

In the prospect of perils that may threaten us during the continuance of war, we hail the arrival of your Excellency among us, and trust to your knowledge and experience in naval matters to adopt such precautions and to erect such defences as will prevent the entrance of hostile ships into our harbors, and avert from our shore the calamities of war; and we earnestly hope that such success may be vouchsafed to the Allied Forces, that the Russian Autocrat may be stopped in his attempts at wrong doing, that the cause of real liberty may be advanced in Europe, that the interruptions to commerce may be speedily removed, and that a general and lasting peace may soon be established on a basis firmer than ever.

We regard this early visit of your Excellency as a proof of the deep interest taken in the well-being of Geelong, and we are therefore induced to refer now to some matters closely identified with our continued prosperity, and we respectfully request that, as great delay and loss have arisen to the community generally from the inadequate wharf accommodation at this port, the attention of your Excellency while staying in Geelong, may be directed to the great natural advantages which exist here for the transaction of an extensive trade, when the Jetties are carried out into deep water, and the passage over the bar is deepened and completed; and we take the liberty earnestly to recommend that some complete plan may be drawn out for the permanent arrangement of the entire harbor, in which the just claims and requirements of every locality shall be fairly and fully recognized.

As the interests of this port are so intimately connected with the landing at the Heads of the mails for Geelong, and the subject has so frequently been placed before the Government by the Chamber of Commerce, we beg urgently to request that this matter may receive the consideration of your Excellency, being convinced that you will rightly appreciate the importance of a service which confers great benefits on this district, without interfering in any degree with the vested rights of others; and we look forward hopefully to the time when the New Post Office shall be erected, the Electric Telegraph completed, and suitable facilities are thus afforded for the satisfactory performance of the duties connected with these departments of the public service.

In conclusion, we pray that your Excellency may long be spared to preside over us, and that your rule may be attended with tranquillity and success; that the efforts made to diffuse education around will be beneficially seen in the increased mental power and enlightenment of the rising generation, and that the teaching in our churches, by their appointed ministers, of the truths of our holy religion, may produce that high morality and purity of life which will bring down on our land the blessing of Heaven!

We, the Members of the Geelong Licensed Victuallers' Protection Society, hail with great satisfaction the opportunity afforded us by your Excellency's visit to this Town, of expressing to your Excellency in person the gratification we all feel at the appointment of your Excellency to the important office of Lieutenant Governor of this Colony.

As loyal and dutiful subjects of our beloved Queen, we should consider it our duty to accord a welcome to any person selected by Her Majesty, as Her Representative; but the prestige attached to your Excellency's name in the Naval Service of the country, and more recently in a diplomatic capacity, affords us increased gratification, and causes us to anticipate with unfeigned pleasure the benefits that will accrue to this Colony from being presided over by a gentleman possessing the experience, firmness, judgment and impartiality, of your Excellency.

In the measures that may be introduced by your Excellency for developing the resources of the country, and promoting the general welfare of the inhabitants of this Colony, we trust that the body we represent may meet with due consideration, and that we may no longer have reason to complain of the great oppression and injustice to which we are subject, compared to other classes of society.

In a congratulatory address, we would willingly abstain from troubling your Excellency with a detailed list of the grievances which we, as a body, complain of, but as we fear we may not, for some time at least, have another opportunity, we therefore beg your Excellency to pardon such apparent incongruity.

Knowing that your Excellency's time since your arrival in the Colony must have been fully occupied in ascertaining the wants of the people, and in endeavouring to remedy the abuses that exist in many official departments, we fear your Excellency may as yet be unacquainted with the difference that exists in the laws relating to Licensed Victuallers, between this Colony and the Mother Country: we beg, therefore, to bring under your Excellency's notice a few of the hardships and disabilities under which we labor, and leave to your Excellency's sense of justice to provide a remedy for, so that we may be placed in the same position as other classes in the Colony, and as our brethren in England occupy.

- 1st. The heavy license fee, and also the additional sum of fifty pounds for transfer of license on disposal of business.
- 2nd. The being prevented, by order of the Immigration Commissioners, from engaging female servants at the several depôts.
- 3rd. The being compelled (without any proportionate allowance) to burn a lamp the whole night, and being subject to a fine or imprisonment for an accidental extinction.
- 4th. The great restrictions placed upon the supply of refreshments on Sundays, so different from the law in England. And
- 5th. The want of a Court of Appeal against the arbitrary and frequently unjust decisions of the magistrates.

In conclusion, we beg to offer our earnest wishes that your Excellency and Lady may be blessed with health and every happiness, and that your Excellency's government may be distinguished above all others for its just, enlightened, and liberal policy.

REWARD FOR DISCOVERING GOLD FIELDS.

THE Lieutenant Governor having had under consideration the desirableness of justly rewarding those persons who may be the discoverers of gold workings, has ordered the publication of the following Regulations, which His Excellency has been pleased to direct to take effect from this date, viz. :—

1. To any person or persons who may satisfactorily establish his or their claim as the discoverer or discoverers of an *available* Gold Field or gold working, an extent of vacant ground in the locality of the discovery, of double or treble the area allowed by the Regulations of 31st December, 1853, will be licensed to him or them.

2. The precise extent of land to be allowed to the discoverer or discoverers, upon proof of the discovery, will be determined by the officer to whom the proof has been tendered.

3. Proof of the discovery must be made at the *earliest possible date* to the Commissioner of Gold Fields in charge of the district in which the discovery may be situated; or in the event of no such officer being within a reasonable distance, such proof may be tendered to the nearest Bench of Magistrates or Resident Magistrate.

Special Instructions for the guidance of Intending Exhibitors.

PUBLIC notice has been given that an Exhibition will be held in Melbourne, in October next, of articles, the natural and artificial productions of this Colony, intended for transmission to the Paris Exhibition, to be held in May, 1855; and also of other articles, the produce of any country, not for transmission to Paris, but to exhibit at Melbourne, and to be subsequently delivered to their respective owners.

The Commissioners have deemed it important that information should be imparted to persons desirous of exhibiting articles on either or both occasions, and it is with this object that the following regulations are published.

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

1. Applications for reserves of space must state the amount in square feet of wall or ground superficies required, and should be sent in before the 5th of September; but, in order that adequate provision may be made to meet the wants of intending exhibitors, it is desirable that such applications be made to the Commissioners as early as possible.

2. The name and address, in full, of the exhibitor, must be ticketed on the specimens in legible characters, and it must be stated whether or not the exhibitor wishes the specimen to be forwarded to Paris, and what is to be done with it ultimately.

3. The zoological and local name of animals, birds, fishes, reptiles, and insects, their habits and the place where found, must, if known, be ticketed on the specimens or the cases or bottles containing them. Similar instructions will apply to specimens from the vegetable kingdom. Minerals should have the scientific and popular name upon each specimen, the labels being rendered adhesive by a solution of gum arabic and sugar.

4. To descriptive particulars accompanying specimens having either commercial value or probable economic application, should be added the mode of saving, curing, preserving, or preparation, together with the quantity capable of being procured or produced, and any other information worthy of being known.

5. Specimens should be neatly and securely packed (particularly those for transmission to Paris) in boxes or packages, and forwarded before the 20th September next, to

[Should any of the packages be deemed unsuitable for the safe transmission of the specimens to Paris, the Commissioners will have proper cases made, and charge the same to the exhibitor.]

6. The form of stands and show-cases for the display of the various specimens will be left to the individual taste of the exhibitors, subject, however, to the approval of the Commissioners, and must be provided at the cost of the exhibitors.

7. Those who desire to exhibit commercial articles in the Exhibition Building, in Melbourne, will be allowed to have attendants in waiting to answer enquiries respecting the same, but cannot be permitted to remove them until the close of the exhibition.

8. A receipt will be given for specimens as received, and they will be arranged, exhibited, and forwarded to Paris free of expense to the owners.

9. Care will be taken of the articles in the exhibition, but the Commissioners will not be responsible for loss or injury on transit to or from Melbourne, or while in the exhibition.

10. The Commissioners will give a testimonial to exhibitors, and award prize medals to those worthy of the distinction.

11. The Commissioners will afford every facility to exhibitors of valuable specimens, to insure the same, on their being transmitted to Paris; and if exhibitors be desirous of disposing of specimens in Paris, will effect their sale, and pay the proceeds to the exhibitors or their agents, after deducting all expenses attendant on such sale. Exhibitors wishing to have their specimens sent to England, may have them forwarded to any part of the United Kingdom on pre-payment of the expense of their transit from Paris to London.

12. Those articles exhibited in Melbourne only will be delivered to the owners, or persons authorised by them, on production of the Commissioners' receipts.
