By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HOTHAM, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Military Order of the Bath, Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS a certain building has been erected at Beechworth, in the Colony of Victoria, at the public expense, as and for a Public Gaol, Prison, and House of Correction for the District of Beechworth; And whereas it is expedient to proclaim the same in pursuance of an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the said Colony, passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "*An Act to make provision for the better control and disposal of Offenders*:" Now therefore I, the Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, do hereby proclaim the said Building at Beechworth as and to be a Public Gaol, Prison and House of Correction for the District of Beechworth aforesaid.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this second day of October, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, and in the eighteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

WANGARATTA GAOL DISCONTINUED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HOTHAM, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Military Order of the Bath, Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a proclamation dated the twenty-third day of February, in the present year, a certain building called and known No. 91.—OCTOBER 6TH, 1854.—1.

as the Watch House, situate at Wangaratta, in the District of Beechworth, was declared to be a Prison, House of Correction and Penal Establishment, pursuant to the Provisions of an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act to make provision for the better control and disposal of Offenders*;" And whereas it is deemed expedient to discontinue the use of the said building as a Prison, House of Correction and Penal Establishment: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the said Act, and of all and every other power and authority enabling me in this behalf, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation of the twenty-third day of February in the present year, and do hereby direct that the use of the said Watch House at Wangaratta aforesaid, as a Prison, House of Correction and Penal Establishment, be from henceforth discontinued.

The notice of the 3rd of June last is hereby cancelled, and the under-written clause is substituted.

REGULATION 9 AS AMENDED.

Country and Special Country Lots put up and not bid for may be claimed without competition.

9. Lands of the 3rd class, viz., Country Lots, including such as are designated "Special Country Lots," which may have been exposed to public competition, at auction, subsequent to the date hereof, but not sold, may be had at their upset price, by the person or persons who may first apply and pay for them, at the Colonial Treasury; but such applications will not be entertained unless the portions of land have been published in the Government Gazette as open to selection. This regulation, however, does not extend to Town or Suburban Allotments, nor to any land that may be held under license from the crown, until the expiration of such license.

FEMALE INDUSTRIAL SCHOOL.
