QUARANTINE:

THE existence of Small-pox on board of the barque Australié, recently arrived from Plymouth, having been reported to the Lieutenant Governor, His Excellency has deemed it necessary to place the vessel, crew, and passengers under Quarantine, in conformity with the provisions of the Acts of Council 3 William IV., No. 1, and 5 Victoria, No. 12, for a period of fourteen days from and after the convalescence of the last case; and all persons are hereby required to take notice thereof accordingly.

The boundaries of the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean are specified in a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of November, 1852.
