### WARRNAMBOOL.

**I**N pursuance of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to direct the publication of the substance and prayer of a Petition to His Excellency, hereinafter set forth, signed by One hundred and sixty-one landowners and householders of the Town of Warrnambool, in the County of Villiers.

The Petitioners state that they are anxious to avail themselves of the provisions of the "*Municipal Institutions Act*," believing that it will be of benefit to the Town by giving the Inhabitants the power to a certain extent of governing themselves; and pray as follows :—

"Your Memorialists therefore most respectfully pray that your Excellency will cause by Pro-

clamation, the Town of Warrnambool to be proclaimed a Municipality, and beg to suggest the following as the boundaries thereof, being the same as defined in schedule F, No. 11, of the "*New Constitution Act*," viz. :—Commencing at a point on the River Hopkins, being the south-western angle of section 1, parish of Wangoom, and bounded on the east by a line bearing north twenty chains; on the north by a line bearing west to the Merri River; on the west and south-west by the Merri River to its mouth; on the south by the sea coast of Warrnambool Bay, from the mouth of the said river to that of the River Hopkins, and thence to the point of commencement.
