## GOVERNMENT DEBENTURES.

**H**IS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to notify that 1000 Debentures, redeemable in equal proportions on the 1st day of January in each of the years 1868, 1869, 1870, 1871 and 1872, are now open for purchase by the public, under the provisions of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 40.

The Debentures are transferable by delivery, and are for the sum of £100 each, bearing interest at the rate of £6 per cent. per annum, payable half-yearly, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, the 1st half-yearly dividend being due and payable on the 1st January, 1856.

The principal and interest of each Debenture will be payable at the option of the holder for the time being, either in Melbourne or London; any change which it may be desired to make in this respect being previously notified, not later than the last dividend day and registered at the Colonial Treasury in Melbourne, and in the Office of the Agent for Victoria, in London, for the present (EDWARD BARNARD, Esq., No. 5, Cannon-row, Westminster) and endorsed upon the Debenture.

Tenders for the purchase of the above Debentures will be received at the Treasury until Twelve o'clock, on Monday, the 29th instant; and on every succeeding Monday morning until further notice, and will be opened at Half-past Twelve on the same day.

The Tenders must be sealed and addressed to the Colonial Treasurer, superscribed "Tender for Government Debentures."

The Tenders will be for the value of the stock, or principal of the Debentures only, irrespective of interest.

If a Tender be accepted the amount tendered, together with the interest accrued since the 1st July last, must be paid in cash.

CLAIMS FOR SERVICES AND SUPPLIES.  
REGULATION.

REPRESENTATIONS having been made to the Government of the unnecessary delay which various Public Officers in the Country Districts have occasioned in the settlement of accounts incurred by them in the name of the Government, His Excellency the Governor has directed the re-publication of the following extract from the regulations of the 1st May, 1853, which is henceforth to be strictly adhered to :—

"Heads of Departments are specially enjoined to take care that no claims against their departments for services or supplies rendered in any month are allowed to be outstanding at the termination of that month."

2. His Excellency has further directed it to be notified for general information, that in each instance of known neglect of the prompt settlement of accounts, the payment of salary to the Officer in charge of the Station where the irregularity occurs will be suspended until an investigation shall have been made into the facts, and until the Head of Department shall have satisfied himself that no other accounts at the same station are unsettled.

Heads of Departments are severally instructed to carry this regulation into effect.
