## CLAIMS FOR SERVICES AND SUPPLIES. REGULATION.

**R**EPRESENTATIONS having been made to the Government of the unnecessary delay which various Public Officers in the Country Districts have occasioned in the settlement of accounts incurred by them in the name of the Government, His Excellency the Governor has directed the re-publication of the following extract from the regulations of the 1st May, 1853, which is henceforth to be strictly adhered to:—  
“Heads of Departments are specially enjoined to take care that no claims against their departments for services or supplies rendered in any month are allowed to be outstanding at the termination of that month.”

2. His Excellency has further directed it to be notified for general information, that in each instance of known neglect of the prompt settlement of accounts, the payment of salary to the Officer in charge of the Station where the irregularity occurs will be suspended until an investigation shall have been made into the facts, and until the Head of Department shall have satisfied himself that no other accounts at the same station are unsettled.

Heads of Departments are severally instructed to carry this regulation into effect.

## GOVERNMENT DEBENTURES.

**H**IS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to notify that 1000 Debentures, redeemable in equal proportions on the 1st day of January in each of the years 1868, 1869, 1870, 1871 and 1872, are now open for purchase by the public, under the provisions of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 40.

The Debentures are transferable by delivery, and are for the sum of £100 each, bearing interest at the rate of £6 per cent. per annum, payable half-yearly, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, the 1st half-yearly dividend being due and payable on the 1st January, 1856.

The principal and interest of each Debenture will be payable at the option of the holder for the time being, either in Melbourne or London; any change which it may be desired to make in this respect being previously notified, not later than the last dividend day and registered at the Colonial Treasury in Melbourne, and in the Office of the Agent for Victoria, in London, for the present (EDWARD BARNARD, Esq., No. 5, Cannon-row, Westminster) and endorsed upon the Debenture.

Tenders for the purchase of the above Debentures will be received at the Treasury until Twelve o'clock, on Monday, the 29th instant; and on every succeeding Monday morning until further notice, and will be opened at Half-past Twelve on the same day.

The Tenders must be sealed and addressed to the Colonial Treasurer, superscribed “Tender for Government Debentures.”

The Tenders will be for the value of the stock, or principal of the Debentures only, irrespective of interest.

If a Tender be accepted the amount tendered, together with the interest accrued since the 1st July last, must be paid in cash.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir CHARLES HOTHAM,  
Knight Commander of the Most Honorable  
Military Order of the Bath, Captain-General  
and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria,  
and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c.,  
&c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by a Proclamation under the  
Hand of the Governor and the Seal of  
the Colony, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of  
June, A.D. 1855, it was declared and appointed  
that the several Districts therein named should  
be Local Court Districts, within the meaning of  
an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council  
of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth  
year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled,  
"*An Act to amend the Laws relating to the Gold  
Fields*," and amongst others the boundaries of  
the Local Court District of Castlemaine were in  
the said Proclamation defined: And whereas it  
has been deemed expedient to sub-divide the said  
Local Court District of Castlemaine and to  
appoint the portions thereof hereinafter described  
to be the Districts of separate Local Courts  
respectively: Now therefore I, the Governor  
of the said Colony, do by this my Proclamation,  
in pursuance of the authority vested in me by  
the said Act, with the advice of the Executive  
Council, revoke so much of the said Proclamation  
as defines the boundaries of the said Local Court  
District of Castlemaine, and with the advice  
aforesaid, I do hereby declare and appoint that  
the several Districts, the boundaries whereof are  
hereinafter described, shall be the Districts of  
separate Local Courts within the meaning of the  
said Act, and shall be called by the names respec-  
tively prefixed thereto, that is to say:—

*Local Court District of Castlemaine.*—Commencing at a point on the River Loddon six miles north of the northern boundary line of the parish of Tarnagulla; thence by a line south-easterly to the south-western angle of the parish of Ravenswood; thence by the southern boundary of the said parish to the parish of Harcourt; thence by the western and northern boundary lines of the said parish of Harcourt and a line south-easterly to Mount Alexander; thence by the Mount Alexander Range to the source of the Myrtle Creek; thence by the Myrtle Creek to its junction with the River Coliban; thence by the River Coliban southwards to its junction with Sawpit Gully; thence by a road one chain wide to the Township of Elphinstone; thence by the main road to Castlemaine to a bridge across Forest Creek near its junction with Wattle Creek; thence by a line south-westerly to a hill known as "The Monk;" thence by a line south-westerly to the junction of Campbell's Creek with the River Loddon; thence by the River Loddon to the parish of Tarnagulla aforesaid; thence by the southern, eastern and northern boundary lines of the said parish of Tarnagulla and the River Loddon to the commencing point.

*Local Court District of Fryer's Creek.*—Commencing at the junction of the Deep Creek with the River Loddon, thence south-easterly by the south bank of the River Loddon to its junction with Campbell's Creek; thence by a line north-easterly to a hill known as "The Monk;"

thence by a line north-easterly to a bridge across Forest Creek near its junction with Wattle Creek; thence easterly by the main Melbourne Road to the Township of Elphinstone; thence east by a road one chain wide to the junction of Sawpit Gully with the River Coliban; thence southwards by the River Coliban to the northern boundary of the Township of Malmsbury; thence by the northern boundary of that township and a line south-westerly to the junction of Middleton's Creek with the River Loddon; thence by a line westerly to the south-east angle of the parish of Carisbrook; thence by the eastern and northern boundary lines of the said parish and by the Deep Creek to the commencing point.

*Local Court District of Hepburn.*—Commencing at the south-east angle of the parish of Carisbrook, thence by a line easterly to the junction of Middleton Creek with the River Loddon; thence by a line north-easterly, and the northern boundary of the Township of Malmsbury to the River Coliban; thence by the River Coliban to the Great Dividing Range; thence by the Great Dividing Range to the source of the Bullarook Creek; thence by the Bullarook Creek to its junction with the Tullaroop Creek; thence by a line bearing west to Mount Greenock Creek; thence by Mount Greenock Creek and the southern boundary of the parish of Carisbrook aforesaid to the commencing point.

*Local Court District of Mount Blackwood.*—Commencing at a point on the Great Dividing Range at the source of the River Moorabool, thence easterly by the Great Dividing Range to the source of the River Campaspe; thence by a line southwards to Mount Bullancrook; thence easterly by the Bullancrook Range to the source of the Djerriwarrah Creek; thence by the Djerriwarrah Creek to its junction with the River Werribee; thence by a line bearing west to the main range between the waters of the Rivers Moorabool and Werribee; thence northwards by that range or watershed to the commencing point on the Great Dividing Range.

# PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS. PORTLAND.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 15, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to direct the publication of the substance and prayer of a Petition to His Excellency, hereinafter set forth, signed by One hundred and seventy-six householders of the Town of Portland, in the County of Normanby.

By His Excellency's Command,  
S.12484. WILLIAM C. HAINES.

The Petitioners state that they are desirous of availing themselves of the provisions of the "Municipal Institutions Act," being of opinion that the population and trade of the town are sufficient to render it desirable that a local government should be forthwith established therein.

They recommend the following limits for the Municipal District, viz.:—A line commencing at the south-east corner of the Electoral Town Boundary, and bounded on the south by a line bearing due west one hundred and ninety chains forty-eight links; on the west by a line bearing north two hundred and seventy-six chains thirty-four links; on the north by a line bearing north eighty-four degrees east thirty-one chains sixty links, and a line bearing north eighty-one degrees thirty minutes; east eight chains twenty-two links to the north-west corner of the Portland Public Cemetery; thence by a line bearing east ten chains, including the said Cemetery, to the sea coast; and on the east by the sea coast southerly to the point of commencement, being the limits of the Electoral District of Portland, as defined by the Act for establishing a New Constitution for this Colony, with an extension to the north, so as to include the public Cemetery.

And the Petitioners pray as follows:—"Your Petitioners therefore pray, that your Excellency may be pleased to declare the locality comprised within the above limits a Municipal District, pursuant to the provisions of the Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria."

The tenders for each station must be separate, and will be accepted or rejected separately. The price must be per ton, including delivery at the stations, and all charges. The net weight only, after deducting the tare, is to be charged.

At stations where straw cannot readily be procured, the tenders may be for hay only; in such cases, the estimated monthly consumption of hay will be increased by one-half the quantity of straw set down in the schedule.

No tender will be entertained unless accompanied by a certificate from two responsible persons that they are willing to become bound as sureties for the due fulfilment of the contract in one-third the estimated cost of the entire supply at the station tendered for; and in the event of the tender being accepted, the bond must be executed within twenty days, failing which, the contract will be again advertised or another tender accepted.

The names of the tenderers and of their proposed sureties must be stated at full length.

All tenders must be enclosed in a separate envelope marked "Tender for ——" (as the case may be), and be deposited in the Tender-box at the Colonial Stores, Great Bourke-street west, or if sent by post they must be addressed to the Colonial Storekeeper, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known on the 4th December, 1855.

#### *Conditions.*

1. The hay to be eaten, good, sound and sweet; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality.

2. The delivery to be made at such times and in such quantities as may be required by the officer of police in charge of the station.
