**ROAD THROUGH ALLOTMENT NO. XII,
PARISH OF MOORPANYAL.**

NOTICE is hereby given that a map and survey plan, describing the exact course and bearings of, and the admeasurements required for a road through allotment No. XII., parish of Moorpanyal, proposed to be made by the Central Road Board, together with a description of the lands through which the same is proposed to pass, and the names of the owners and occupiers thereof so far as known, and also an estimate of the expense of the said work, have been deposited in the office of the Surveyor General, Melbourne, the particulars of which are as follow:—

The road commences at a point on the south boundary of allotment No. XII., in the parish of Moorpanyal four chains from the east end thereof, bearing north 316 degrees 12 minutes 54 chains, passing through the property of John Highett, to the north boundary of the same allotment, No. XII.

The quantity of land required for the proposed road is five acres one rood and twenty-four perches, and the estimated cost of effecting the said work is two hundred and forty-three pounds.

All persons affected by the proposed road are requested to set forth in writing, addressed to the President of the Central Road Board, within forty days from the first publication of this notice, any well-grounded objections that they may have to the said road, failing which they will be thereafter precluded from making any such objections or claiming any compensation whatsoever.

5. The name and address of the manager is George Goldsack, Ballaarat, engineer, who is to be called the Manager of the Ballaarat Mining, Quartz Crushing, Amalgamating and Subliming Company.

6. The Company is formed for the purpose of working mines on the Cost Book System, under the provisions of the "*Act for the better regulation of Mining Companies*," and the following are the rules of the Company.

No. 1.

That a general meeting of all the shareholders shall be held once in every month, and the mode of summoning such meeting shall be as follows:

By at least two days notice being given previous to such meeting by the manager for the time being of the Company to each of the shareholders of the Company, or left at his last known place of abode.

No. 2.

That for the convening of special general meetings the number of shareholders necessary to convene such meeting shall be 16 (each shareholder must hold at least one share), and notice thereof is to be given in the manner pointed out in Rule No. 1.

No. 3.

That the number of votes each shareholder shall have at any such general or special general meeting shall not exceed two, and the second vote shall be by proxy in writing deposited with

the manager of the Company previous to such meeting.

No shareholder shall be limited to the number of shares held by him, and every proxy shall be produced by the manager at every such meeting, and shall be subject to the approval of the shareholders present at the meeting, and no shareholder shall hold more than one proxy independently of his own vote.

No. 4.

That the number of shareholders necessary to form a quorum for inspecting and passing the accounts of the manager, and transacting the ordinary business of the Company, and for removing or appointing a manager, declaring dividends, or making calls shall be 20 (including proxies.)

No. 5.

That there shall be no transfer or relinquishment of shares by shareholders unless by approval of the shareholders to the number of 16 at the least, who shall form a quorum, assented to at a general meeting, and on the payment of all calls and upon giving notice in writing to the manager, and that every such transfer, shall be according to the form in the Schedule A to the Act before mentioned annexed, such form being as follows:—

No. 6.

That it shall be obligatory on the manager of the Company to perform the following duties, that is to say, to keep at the place of business of the Company a book, in which shall be entered the name and place of business of the Company and the number of shares into which it is divided, the names and residences of the shareholders, and the number of shares held by each, the account of each with the Company, all transfers of shares, the minutes of all general and special general meetings of the shareholders, and a debtor and creditor account of all disbursements and receipts of the Company, and of all sums owing to it or by it, which book may be inspected by shareholders at all reasonable times; to make out once in every month a list of the names and addresses of the shareholders for the time being, which shall be kept at the place of business, and may be inspected by any person on the payment of two shillings and sixpence; to make out once in every two months a fair balance sheet of the accounts of the mine, and also a report of the works, which balance sheet and reports shall be submitted to the general meetings of the share-

holders; and to convene general and special general meetings at the request of shareholders, in the manner provided for by Rules, Nos. 1 and 2.

No. 7.

That the appointment of a committee with special powers shall be made at a general meeting of shareholders, and shall be called the managing committee, and they shall consist of five shareholders; but such managing committee shall not continue in existence (unless re-appointed) beyond the next general meeting, and all acts done by the managing committee shall be subject to the review of the next general meeting.

No. 8.

No. 10.

That the manager shall be paid for his services by a per-centage on the amount of gold or money realised by the Company, the amount of such per-centage to be fixed at a general or special meeting of the shareholders of the said Company, held in pursuance of Rules Nos. 1 and 2 (at which there shall be present not less than sixteen shareholders), but all other persons engaged by the Company (except the solicitor) shall be paid by wages, the amount thereof to be settled by the managing committee.

No. 11.

That the managing committee appointed in pursuance of Rule No. 7 shall consist of five of the shareholders, any three of whom shall form a quorum, and be competent to proceed to transact business at any meetings held by them, and the manager of the Company shall be one of the above five; but at no such meeting shall the quorum above named commence or transact any business unless the manager shall satisfy

IN accordance with the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 37, sec. 17, it is hereby notified that the following Regulations, applicable to the district of Sandhurst, have been assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

Regulations made by the Local Court of the District of Sandhurst.

V.—Extent of Claim in Quartz Leases.

That all land comprised in leases and claims in quartz mining shall be marked in a manner that can be distinguished by the public.

Such leases and registered claims to be marked by posts three feet above the ground, and painted white, with the number of lease and yards occupied, painted on the inner side, facing the ground occupied.

The posts to be placed firmly in the ground at each end of claim.

VI.—Management of Puddling Machines.

1. That all water tanks (where practicable) be constructed on the side of the gully.

2. That all tanks (where practicable) be excavated to the bed rock.

3. Any party wishing to form water tanks must give a fortnight's notice of application to the Resident Warden, such notice to be posted in the neighborhood of the site applied for.

4. The slush channel (where practicable) shall be down the centre of the gully.

5. The proprietors of each machine shall make a channel into the centre channel.

VII.—Management of Quartz Crushing Machines.

1. All quartz crushing machines in this District shall keep on the premises a correct weighing machine.

2. All quartz shall be weighed by avoirdupois weight, viz., 112lbs. to the cwt.

3. The premises connected with quartz crushing machines shall be enclosed, and the stone when crushed (if circumstances compel it to be detained on the premises over-night) shall be deposited under a covered shed, and accommodation afforded for a watchman, when required by owners of quartz.
