ROAD THROUGH ALLOTMENT NO. XII., PARISH OF MOORPANYAL.

NOTICE is hereby given that a map and survey plan, describing the exact course and bearings of, and the admeasurements required for a road through allotment No. XII., parish of Moorpanyal, proposed to be made by the Central Road Board, together with a description of the lands through which the same is proposed to pass, and the names of the owners and occupiers thereof so far as known, and also an estimate of the expense of the said work, have been deposited in the office of the Surveyor General, Melbourne, the particulars of which are as follow:—

The road commences at a point on the south boundary of allotment No. XII., in the parish of Moorpanyal four chains from the east end thereof, bearing north 316 degrees 12 minutes 54 chains, passing through the property of John Highett, to the north boundary of the same allotment, No. XII.

Her Majesty's thanks to the Troops, French as well as English, have, at the same time, been joyfully proclaimed: so that here, and throughout the Australian Command, there is not a Soldier who, in his inmost heart, does not wish that he could have merited and shared in those acknowledgments.

But it is our duty to remain steadfast at the posts which have been assigned to us. It is, however, for many in your ranks a proud reflection that the humble cottage and the lowly hearth which have cherished your early days, is the type of the hearths and cottages which have sent forth the host of brave troops who have so successfully battled in their country's cause. The same free institutions have trained up from boyhood both you and them; and, when men, the same modes of discipline have rendered you alike skilful and formidable in arms.

As regards yourselves, let then the past achievements of the several Regiments serving within this Command, the names of which Fame has rendered imperishable on the roll of victories, stir up in your minds a determination to be true men, such as were the countless numbers who, in different periods of the past, have beheld the same ancient banners floating above their heads as now wave over yours.

Some, unfortunately, there are, who are not present to share in your rejoicings. They are the men, who, as deserters, have been untrue to those Colours; some now undergoing the penalty, which, according to a just Military Code, has been awarded for their offences, and others still at large. The former, in every instance, where it is a first offence, shall be pardoned; and the latter shall, under like circumstances, be leniently dealt with, provided they surrender themselves before the end of the present year.

When they return to the ranks, let them be received with the frank comradeship of fellow Soldiers, whose great mistake it has been to throw aside the advantages of their profession. So restored, they will, to their latest day, have cause to remember "SEBASTOPOL."

MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF WARRNAMBOOL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir CHARLES HOTHAM, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Military Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "*An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*," it is amongst other things enacted, that any district of the Colony of Victoria, the area whereof shall not exceed nine square miles, and which shall contain a population of householders not less than three hundred, may, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be constituted a Municipal District as thereafter mentioned, provided that no one point in any such area shall be distant more than six miles from any other point; and it is further enacted that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition, signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district may be declared a Municipal District under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter petition, signed by an equal or greater number of householders resident within such locality, shall have been delivered at the Office of the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice aforesaid, may, if he think fit, declare by Proclamation such locality a Municipal District by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation may define the limits and boundaries of such Municipal District, and such limits and boundaries at any time thereafter in the same manner on receipt of a similar petition may vary and alter, but so as in no case, save as thereafter mentioned, to include

within the limits or boundaries of such Municipal District an area of more than nine square miles, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined shall be deemed and taken to be a Municipal District within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor by the householders resident within the town of Warrnambool, in the County of Villiers, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published, as directed by the said Act, but no counter petition has been delivered in opposition thereto within the time allowed by law: Now therefore I, the Governor of the said Colony, do by this my Proclamation, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that the district herein-after described and named, shall be a Municipal District within the meaning of the said Act: that is to say,—

MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF WARRNAMBOOL.

Commencing at a point on the River Hopkins, being the south-western angle of section 1, parish of Wangoon, thence by a line bearing north eighty chains; thence by a line bearing west to the Merri River; thence by the Merri River to its mouth; thence on the south by the sea coast of Warrnambool Bay from the mouth of the said Merri River to the mouth of the River Hopkins; and thence by the west bank of that river to the point of commencement.

And I do hereby, with the advice aforesaid, direct that the Council of the said Municipal District shall be called by the name and style of "The Council of the Municipal District of Warrnambool."
