DEPASTURE LICENSES, 1855.

THE Lieutenant Governor directs it to be notified to the Occupants of Crown Lands as follows:—

1. The License Fees for the current year are payable at the Colonial Treasury on or before the 31st of March now next ensuing.

2. After the said 31st of March, License Fees will not be received at the Treasury, unless within sixty days thence next ensuing, and upon payment of an additional sum equal to one-fourth of the amount of the License Fee.

3. Defaulters who shall not have made such payment within sixty days as last aforesaid will absolutely forfeit their claims to leases and right to further occupation of their Runs, according to the 5th Section of Chapter 2 of the Order in Council.

DENOMINATIONAL SCHOOLS.

THE Lieutenant Governor has directed the publication of the following arrangement adopted by the Denominational School Board for the first quarter of the year 1855.

By His Excellency's Command,

M.1465. **WILLIAM C. HAINES.**

[CIRCULAR.]

THE Denominational School Board request the attention of School Managers to the following points to be observed as a provisional arrangement during the first quarter of the present year.

1. Allowances to Teachers will be paid at the same rates as in 1854, subject to attendance as follows:—One Master or Mistress, if thirty in average attendance; Master and Mistress, if sixty in average attendance; Master and Assistant, if fifty in average attendance. Schools with an average attendance of less than thirty scholars may be supported in special cases, in localities where there is only one school connected with the Board accessible to the children, but from the 1st of January, 1855, no two schools will be supported in one locality unless the average attendance comes up to the required standard.

2. Sewing Mistresses may also be employed where there is an average attendance of thirty scholars.

3. Pupil Teachers will be appointed in approved schools with the sanction of the Board, after examination, and will be paid on further examination, according to their qualifications.

4. Teachers of Schools in Melbourne and Geelong will not be paid at town rates unless there is an average attendance of at least fifty scholars.

5. House allowances will not be paid to Teachers of Schools with less than thirty in average attendance.

6. In the case of Industrial Schools, grants may be made at the discretion of the Board towards the purchase of tools and apparatus.

7. Where a superior school is connected with an elementary school in the mode pointed out in the "Proposed Rules," published in the last Report of the Board, the payment of a school-fee not exceeding £2 per quarter may be sanctioned. In other schools, the school-fees cannot exceed £1 per quarter in advance, or 2s. per week.

8. Claims for aid in the erection of school-buildings presented to the Board after the 1st January, 1855, will in no case be met to the extent of more than one-half the entire cost to be incurred; and the amount of the Grant will be regulated by the extent of accommodation furnished for scholars or teachers. The remaining moiety must be locally subscribed, and an original subscription list to that amount must be forwarded with the application.

9. Outstanding claims will be carried over from 1854 to the account of 1855, and will be provided for in the first place by the Board, according to their judgment of all the circumstances of each case, to such an extent as the funds placed at their disposal will permit.

10. All applications for grants of money in aid of the erection or enlargement of school buildings, and all applications for the maintenance of new schools, are to be forwarded through Heads of Denominations; but the Board will not require other applications to be so forwarded, unless it be the wish of the parties concerned.

11. The Board will receive written applications for Teachers for schools, and recommend for appointment such persons as are found to be duly qualified on examination by one of their Inspectors appointed for that purpose.

Teachers seeking employment are invited to leave their names and addresses for record at the Office of the Board, 129, Lonsdale-street west.

12. Correspondents are requested to write on distinct subjects in separate letters.

N.B.—It is the duty of the Board to state, with reference to Grants in aid of school buildings, that they have at present at their disposal only £10,000 to meet outstanding claims to the amount of above £35,000; and as those which remain unprovided for have a prior claim, as compared with later applications, it is clear that the Board cannot hold out hopes of new claims being provided for until provision is made to meet such cases by the Legislature.

In the meantime, the support of new schools by annual allowances will be provided for as a primary object.

The requisitions for general stores are to be made quarterly, on the 1st January, 1st April, 1st July, 1st October, respectively; and Heads of Departments are hereby expressly enjoined to transmit their applications to the Colonial Storekeeper in due time, and to make provision for the requirements of the subsequent three months. Fourteen days after the receipt of the requisition the supplies will be furnished.

3. The requisitions for forage are to be rendered on the 25th of each month, for the service of the month ensuing.

4. Provisions will be supplied as heretofore upon a daily voucher, covered by a monthly requisition.

5. The Storekeeper, unless with the especial sanction of the Lieutenant Governor, is on no account to furnish supplies to any department by which timely provision—as directed by these regulations—shall have been neglected.

6. Such articles only are to be placed in requisition as are allowed by the regulations of the Government Service for the time being, or as are indispensable for the proper conduct of the public service; and in all cases the size, weight, measurement, or quantity is to be given, as well as a correct description of the articles.

7. On receiving requisitions completed in conformity with these regulations, the Storekeeper is to report as to the cost of the articles for the approval of the Lieutenant Governor.
