## UNLAWFUL CULTIVATION OF CROWN LANDS.

A REPRESENTATION having been made to the Government, in a communication dated the 20th instant, that certain parties are in the habit of vending agricultural produce raised on Crown Lands, the attention of all occupants of Crown Lands is hereby directed to the Notice of the 24th of April, 1854, cautioning them against cultivating Crown Lands, under color of supplying the necessaries of life at the Gold Fields, or other populous districts of the Colony, in contravention of the provision contained in the 2nd chapter of the Order in Council of 9th March, 1847, and they are hereby informed that any breach of the Regulation in question will subject them to the penalties inflicted by the 3rd section of the Act of Parliament, 9 and 10 Victoria, cap. 104.

## DEPASTURE LICENSES, 1855.

THE Lieutenant Governor directs it to be notified to the Occupants of Crown Lands as follows:—

1. The License Fees for the current year are payable at the Colonial Treasury on or before the 31st of March now next ensuing.
2. After the said 31st of March, License Fees will not be received at the Treasury, unless within sixty days thence next ensuing, and upon payment of an additional sum equal to one-fourth of the amount of the License Fee.
3. Defaulters who shall not have made such payment within sixty days as last aforesaid will absolutely forfeit their claims to leases and right to further occupation of their Runs, according to the 5th Section of Chapter 2 of the Order in Council.

**W**HEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "*An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*," it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor from time to time to proclaim by notice in the *Government Gazette* the Roads in the said Colony which should be and be deemed Main Roads under the provisions of the said Act; And whereas the said Act was amended by another Act passed in the seventeenth year of the same Reign, intituled, "*An Act to amend an Act intituled, 'An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria.'*" Now therefore I, the Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony, do hereby proclaim and direct, in pursuance of the said first recited Act, that the road commonly called and known as "The Great Western Road," commencing at the western extremity of Aberdeen-street, in the town of Geelong, and county of Grant, and from thence through the township of Inverleigh, to the township of Cressy, both in the county of Grenville; and also the road commonly called and known as "The Upper Western Road," commencing at the western extremity of Mercer-street, in the town of Geelong, and county of Grant, thence by Batesford Bridge, through the township of Teesdale, in the said county, thence through the townships of Shelford and Rokewood, in the county of Grenville, to the township of Pitfield, in the said county; and also the road commonly called and known as "The Colac Road," commencing at the southern extremity of Moorabool-street, in the town of Geelong, and county of Grant, thence through the township of Winchelsea, in the said county, to the township of Colac, in the county of Polwarth; and also the road commonly called and known as "The Ballaarat Road," commencing at a point on the Great Western Road near Fyansford Reserve, in the county of Grant, thence through the townships of Lethbridge, Meredith, and Buninyong, in the said county, to the township of Ballaarat, in the county of Grenville; and also the road commonly called and known as "The Pascoe Vale Road," which diverges from the Mount Alexander Road at a distance of about four miles from Melbourne, and passes in a northerly direction by the township of Essendon, crosses the Moonee Ponds Creek, thence passes northward through the parishes of Jika Jika, Will-will-rook, and Yuroke, till it joins the main Sydney Road near Campbellfield; and also the road commonly called and known as "The Deep Creek Road," commencing at its point of divergence from the Mount Alexander Road near the north-west corner of the township of Essendon, taking a north-westerly direction through the parishes of Doutta Galla and Tullamarine, to the township of Bulla Bulla and Sunbury, and thence through Clarke's Special



Survey to Gisborne, shall be and be deemed Main Roads within the meaning of the said Acts.

#### LOCAL PAYMENT OF PURCHASE MONEY FOR CROWN LANDS.

THE Lieutenant Governor has been pleased to authorize the following Regulations, with a view of affording facility to purchasers of Crown Lands at sales held in the Country Districts; to complete the payment of their purchase money at the place of sale, it being understood that they apply only to places where a Gold Receiver's Office or branch of one of the Government Banks is established:—

1. Purchasers of Crown Lands may pay the whole amount of their purchase money to the Police Magistrate, or other officer conducting the sale, at once, if they desire to do so, instead of the deposit of ten per cent. usually taken.

2. Balances of purchase money may be afterwards paid to the officer conducting the sale on the purchaser intimating at the time of sale his intention to do so.

3. Advice of such intention should be given to the Colonial Treasurer or Sub-Treasurer by the officer who forwards the report of sale, so as to prevent the possibility of a balance being twice paid.

4. No such balance would be received at the Treasury or Sub-Treasury, unless it be shewn that it has not been paid at the place of sale.

5. The officer conducting the sale will name a day when balances will be received by him, and will forward the same in one remittance in cash by Escort, or by Bank draft procured at par, together with a list of particulars of the balances, which he will transmit in time to ensure their arrival at the Treasury or Sub-Treasury (as the case may be) within the month after the day of sale prescribed by law for the receipt of such balances.

6. The usual Treasury receipts for the balances will be forwarded to the officer who conducted the sale for delivery to the parties entitled to them.

EMERALD HILL.

**I**N pursuance of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 15, the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to direct the publication of the substance and prayer of a Petition to His Excellency, signed by three hundred and eighty-seven householders, resident in the district commonly called and known as "Emerald Hill," South Melbourne, in the County of Bourke, setting forth—

**I**N pursuance of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 15, the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to direct the publication of the substance and prayer of a Petition to His Excellency, signed by six hundred and ninety-six landowners and householders of the district commonly called and known as "Pahran," in the County of Bourke, setting forth—

The urgent necessity which exists for the immediate operation of the said Act in the district which they represent. The Petitioners state—

"That in order to make a municipality efficient, and to enable it practically to work successfully for the benefit of its inhabitants, as well as to become conducive to general purposes of utility, stability in its resources must form a primary element in its constitution, to secure which your Petitioners would venture to point out the following as the limits or boundaries of the municipal district under which your Petitioners seek to be incorporated, namely :—

**REQUISITIONS.**

**T**HE Lieutenant Governor has been pleased to approve of the following Revised Regulations relative to requisitions for supplies heretofore furnished by the Civil Commissariat, and to direct the former regulations on the same subject to be cancelled :—

1. Requisitions for authorized supplies of all kinds are to be made upon the Colonial Storekeeper in the form annexed, and must be signed by the Officer in charge, and by the Head of the Department.

2. The requisitions for general stores are to be made quarterly, on the 1st January, 1st April, 1st July, 1st October, respectively; and Heads of Departments are hereby expressly enjoined to transmit their applications to the Colonial Storekeeper in due time, and to make provision for the requirements of the subsequent three months. Fourteen days after the receipt of the requisition the supplies will be furnished.

3. The requisitions for forage are to be rendered on the 25th of each month, for the service of the month ensuing.

4. Provisions will be supplied as heretofore upon a daily voucher, covered by a monthly requisition.

5. The Storekeeper, unless with the especial sanction of the Lieutenant Governor, is on no account to furnish supplies to any department by which timely provision—as directed by these regulations—shall have been neglected.

6. Such articles only are to be placed in requisition as are allowed by the regulations of the Government Service for the time being, or as are indispensable for the proper conduct of the public service; and in all cases the size, weight, measurement, or quantity is to be given, as well as a correct description of the articles.

7. On receiving requisitions completed in conformity with these regulations, the Storekeeper is to report as to the cost of the articles for the approval of the Lieutenant Governor.
