## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HOTHAM. Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Military Order of the Bath, Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "An Act to provide for the "Management of Towns and other places in "Victoria," it is amongst other things enacted that certain provisions of the said Act relating to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X. in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such citics, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor might, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, declare to come under the operation of the same, respectively, or any of them, and that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits, and to revoke any such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant Governor aforesaid, do, by this my Proclamation, No. 2.—JANUARY 5TH, 1855.—3.

in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act. declare and appoint that the sections of the said Act, being numbered V., VI., VII., VIII. and IX., shall extend to and be in force within the following cities, towns, districts, and places, that is to say :-

The City of MELBOURNE and the country surrounding the corporate boundaries of the said city, and extending a distance of five miles from those boundaries, and all towns and places within the limits so described; and I do define such limits to be as follows, namely:—Commencing at a point on the coast of Port Phillip Bay, which is the south-eastern corner of T.
