PROCLAMATION

HEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled,
"An Act to provide for the Management of

POLICE DISTRICTS OF PORTLAND AND HAMILTON.
