**PETITION FOR MUNICIPAL INSTI-
TUTIONS.**

CASTLEMAINE.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council, 18 Victoria, No. 15, the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to direct the publication of the substance and prayer of a Petition to His Excellency, signed by one hundred and fifty-three landowners and householders of and in the township of Castlemaine, setting forth—

That the petitioners are desirous of availing themselves of the beneficial operation of the said Act;

And praying as follows:—

“Wherefore your petitioners do most respectfully pray that your Excellency may be graciously pleased to cause the said township of Castlemaine to be proclaimed, in due form of law, a municipal district, by the name of ‘The Municipality of Castlemaine,’ and also that the boundaries of the said municipal district may be regulated pursuant to the provisions of the said Act of Council.”

CHARITABLE INSTITUTIONS.

POLICE REWARD FUND.

THE Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to rescind the Regulations dated the 30th day of May, 1853, for the management and disposal of the Police Reward Fund, as constituted by the Act of Council, 16 Victoria, No. 24; and to direct that the following Regulations for the management and disposal of the said Fund shall have effect from and after the 1st of January, 1855.

2. The Fund is to consist of all fines imposed on any member of the Police Force, under the provisions of the Act, and of all penalties and damages awarded to any member of the Police upon the summary conviction of any offender, following an information by such member of the Force.

3. All sums accruing to this Fund are to be paid to the Colonial Treasurer; and the several Clerks of Petty Sessions in accounting for them will enter them in their vouchers, in a column distinct from other collections.

4. The fund thus arising shall be divided into two equal portions, one to be called "*The Benefit Fund*," the other "*The Reward Fund*."

5. The amount at present to the credit of the *Police Reward Fund* shall be divided into two equal portions, one to be paid into the *Benefit Fund*, the other into the *Reward Fund*.

6. Should any balance remain to the credit of the *Reward Fund* at the end of the year, after all payments authorised by these regulations shall have been made, such balance shall be paid into, and form a part of, the *Benefit Fund*, at the following times, viz:—Three-fourth parts thereof at the end of the year, and the remaining one-fourth part (retained to meet accruing claims) so soon as an equal amount shall have accrued from the monies received during the ensuing year.

7. All sums paid into the *Benefit Fund* shall be so invested (in Government debentures if possible) as to yield an annual interest, to be added from time to time, as it may become due, to the principal.

8. There shall be paid out of the *Benefit Fund* to members of the Police Force who shall have served for ten years, an annual retiring pension, of an amount to be determined by His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

9. On the report of a Board appointed by His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, gratuities not exceeding one year's pay shall be paid from the *Benefit Fund* to any members of the Police Force who shall be compelled to leave the service by reason of any injury or illness received or contracted in the discharge of their duties; and in cases where injuries so received shall not be such as to compel the individual to leave the Force, it shall be in the discretion of His Excellency, on the recommendation of the Chief Commissioner, to authorise payment from the *Benefit Fund* of the amount of medical expenses incurred by such individual by reason of the injuries thus received.

10. Should any member of the Police lose his life in the discharge of his duty, his widow shall be entitled to a gratuity not exceeding one year's pay, to be paid out of the *Benefit Fund*.

11. Members of the Police Force who have been six months in the service without incurring any punishment exceeding a fine of 20s., shall be entitled to receive from the *Benefit Fund* a sum of 6d. per diem, to be called "*Good Conduct Pay*."

12. The "*Good Conduct Pay*" will be forfeited for three months by any member of the Force having a claim upon it, on his incurring a fine exceeding 20s., but less than £3; and in the event of any member of the Force being fined £3 or upwards, or being sentenced to imprisonment, he shall forfeit his good conduct pay for a period of six months.

13. The amount of good conduct money payable to each member of the Police Force shall be entered to his credit in a book to be kept for that purpose by the Inspector of Police, and the whole shall be paid to him in one sum at the end of his term of service.

14. Any member of the Police Force who shall be dismissed from the Force shall forfeit all claim to any payment from the *Benefit Fund*.

15. Immediately after the close of each month, the Clerks of Petty Sessions will forward a return (in such form as may be prescribed by the Chief Commissioner of Police) to the Inspector of the District to which they may respectively belong, giving a distinct account of the sums accruing to the fund during the month, and the names of the constables through whose exertions convictions have taken place, and who are recommended by the bench of magistrates for a reward. The Inspectors will forward these returns without delay to the Chief Commissioner of Police, with such remarks upon the respective merits of the Constabulary within their districts as they consider necessary, and with such recommendations for rewards to individual members of the Force as they think proper.

16. On the receipt of these returns, the Chief Commissioner of Police will, if he approve the recommendation, forthwith take the necessary steps to cause payment to be made to each person of such reward as is suggested by any Bench of Magistrates, or any Inspector of Police: Provided that, without the special approbation of the Lieutenant Governor, no reward exceeding £5 shall be paid to any individual member of the Force.

17. In cases of conviction for the illegal sale of spirituous and fermented liquors, the sum of £5 shall be allowed to each of any two constables who may give evidence for the prosecution; but should there be more than two constables concerned, the £10 thus allowed shall be divided among them all, and all expenses incurred in the prosecution shall be defrayed out of this reward.

18. Should any member of the Police die, having a claim upon any portion of the *Reward Fund*, his widow shall be entitled to receive the amount.

19. Information shall be given to any person employed in the Police Force who may desire to know the amount accruing to him under these regulations.

20. An annual account of the receipts and disbursements of the *Police Reward and Benefit Funds* will be made by the Auditor-General as soon as possible after the termination of each year, and be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.
