RESERVED ACT OF COUNCIL CONFIRMED.

THE Lieutenant Governor has directed it to be notified that His Excellency has received a Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies (No. 3) dated 15th February, 1855, transmitting the following Order of the Queen in Council, confirming the Reserved Act of the Lieutenaut Governor and Legislative Council of this Colony, passed in the seventeenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to extend the Elective Franchise," and stating that the said Act has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of thirty days, as required by the Act of Parliament 13 and 14 Victoria, cap. 59, sec. 32.

Whereas by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament holden in the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for the Government of New South Wales and Van "Diemen's Land," it is amongst other things enacted that "no Bill which shall be reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon shall have any force or authority within the Colony of New South Wales until the Governor of the said Colony shall signify, either by speech or message, to the Legislative Council of the said Colony, or by Proclamation as therein aforesaid, that such Bill has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same." And whereas by another Act passed in the Session of Parliament holden in the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for the better Government of Her "Majesty's Australian Colonies," it was provided, amongst other things, that the provisions of the said former Act concerning the reservation of Bills for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure should apply to and be in force in the Colony of Victoria. And whereas it was by the same Act further provided that "it should be lawful for the Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, after the establishment of a Legislative Council therein under the said Act, from time to time by any Act or Acts to alter the provisions or laws for the time being in force under the said Act, or otherwise, concerning the election of the Elective Members of such Legislative Council, the qualification of Electors and Elective Members, or to establish in the said Colony, instead of the Legislative Council, a Council and a House of Representatives, or other separate Legislative Houses, to consist respectively of such members to be appointed or elected respectively by such persons and in such manner as by such Act or Acts should be determined, and to vest in such Council and House of Representatives, or such Act or Acts should be determined, and to vest in such Council and House of Representatives, or other separate Legislative Houses, the powers and functions of the Legislative Council for which the same might be substituted: Provided always that every Bill which should be passed by the Council in the said Colony for any of such purposes should be reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon; and a copy of such Bill should be laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of thirty days, at the least, before Her Majesty's pleasure thereon should be signified." And whereas the Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony of Victoria has reserved a certain Bill, passed by the Legislative Council of the said Colony in the Session of that Council holden in the year 1854, intituled, "An Act to extend the Elective Franchise of Victoria," for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon. And whereas the said Bill so reserved as aforesaid had been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of thirty days as aforesaid, and has now been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and it is expedient that the said Bill should be assented to by Her Majesty: Now therefore Her Majesty, in pursuance of the said Acts, and in exercise of the powers thereby reserved to Her Majesty as aforesaid, doth by this present order, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, declare her assent to the said Bill.
